Subject: Response to Freedom of Information (FOIA) Request NPS-2018-00871

This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated June 18, 2018, in which you requested Investigative records related to the 1991 disappearance of Dan Campbell.

Your request was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. § 552) and the Department of Interior's FOIA regulations (43 CFR Part 2). Upon further review, your request is granted in part and denied in part. We are releasing 45 pages of responsive materials. However, portions of three pages are being withheld under Exemption 6 and 7(C).

Exemption 6 allows us to withhold information that if released would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Exemption 7(C) allows us to withhold information from law enforcement files that could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

The information being withheld consists of personally identifiable information for individuals other than yourself. We have determined that the individuals to whom this information pertains have a substantial privacy interest in withholding it. You have not provided information that explains a relevant public interest under the FOIA in the disclosure of this personal information. Additionally, we have determined that the disclosure of this information would shed little or no light on the performance of the agency's statutory duties. Because the harm to personal privacy is greater than whatever public interest might be served by disclosure, we have determined that the release of the information that is being withheld would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the privacy of these individuals and we are therefore withholding it under Exemptions 6 and 7(C).

The investigative materials you have requested are maintained in a Privacy Act System of Records (DOI-10). Therefore, although some or all of the information being withheld may be known to you through other means, we are obligated under the Privacy Act and FOIA to withhold that information.

An additional 6 files, totaling approximately 433 pages of responsive material, and a portion of one of the pages that are being released to you relate to a case that is currently open. We have determined that releasing that information could reasonably be expected to interfere with those ongoing enforcement proceedings. A premature release of the information contained in the report could harm future enforcement proceedings because it could:

- Afford a virtual roadmap through the government's evidence.
- Prematurely reveal the full scope of the evidence that has been obtained to date.
- Hinder the NPS's ability to further control and shape the investigation
- Could expose actual or prospective witnesses to undue influence or retaliation.

We are therefore withholding the report in accordance with Exemption 7(A) of the Freedom of Information Act 5 U.S.C. § 552. The total volume of materials being withheld is 433.

Please note, you are more than welcome to resubmit your request after the enforcement action has been completed. However, at this time we are unable to provide you with an estimate of when that might be.

The appeal should be marked, both on the envelope and the face of the appeal letter, with the legend "FREEDOM OF INFORMATION APPEAL." You should also include an explanation of why you believe the National Park Service's response was in error. Appeals arriving on or delivered after 5 p.m. ET., Monday through Friday, will be deemed received on the next workday.

Also as part of the 2007 OPEN Government Act FOIA amendments, the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) was created to offer mediation services to resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a nonexclusive alternative to litigation. 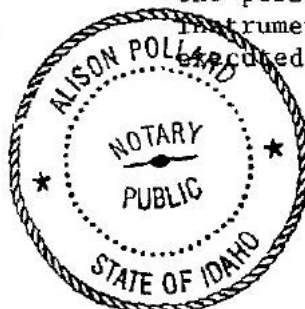

## CIB called in on missing man probe

LIVINGSTON (AP) — The Montana Criminal Investigation Bureau will try to find out what happened to Dan Campbell, a Big Timber elk horn hunter missing in Yellowstone National Park since early April.

Bureau Chief Tom Adamo said Thursday the request for assistance came from Park County.

Adamo said an agent traveled to Park County this week "to get a feel for what's going on" and

has been in contact with county and Yellowstone law enforcement officers.

Campbell, 42, was reported missing by his girlfriend, who said he went into the park to gather elk antlers, an illegal activity, and never came back out.

Campbell has disappeared before, members of his family said, but they insist he didn't have the money, motive or method to do so now.
