


Longmire Winter Trails and Activities



 4.6 mile loop trail; very steep terrain Begins along the west side of the Trail of the Shadows, across the road from the National Park Inn Difficulty: advanced trail for snowshoers; 	 not recommended for skiers Narrow trail through forest; often requires route-finding. Do not travel on the Longmire-Paradise road
 3.8 miles round-trip from Longmire to Cougar Rock Campground; rolling terrain Difficulty: intermediate 	 Narrow trail through the forest; may require some route-finding Do not travel on the Longmire-Paradise road
 Begins at the campground entrance, 2 miles above Longmire toward Paradise Difficulty: novice 	Flat terrain; follows snow-covered loops of campgroundMay encounter snowmobiles
 2.2 miles round-trip along Wonderland Trail Begins on the curve just below Cougar Rock Campground Difficulty: advanced Gradually uphill with some steep sections; narrow trail through forest; requires route- 	 finding skills Crossing the Nisqually River may be impossible if storms or floods have damaged the footbridge. Tire Chains and Safe Driving Between November 1 and May 1, all vehicles entering Mount Rainier National Park are required to carry properly fitting tire chains* (including 4-wheel-drive and all-wheel-drive vehicles). Tire chains may be required at anytime while driving in the park. Signs posted along the roadway indicate traction device requirements.	traction requirements. Poor visibility and reduced traction present driving hazards during winter. Shady areas and bridge surfaces can be treacherously icy even when other sections of roadway are not. Use caution and stay alert!
Chains are available at local stores outside of the park. For your own safety, always follow	* Autosocks are allowed for passenger vehicles under 10,000 pounds as an alternative to tire chains.
