Fire Update – September 11, 2020

Weather once again was the driving factor in fighting fire yesterday. There was more smoke from foreign fires and thicker marine layer that extended farther inland. The sun could not get through these two layers so the fog stuck around all day. Temperatures were lower again.

Lower temperatures and higher humidity tend to keep fire activity to a minimum.

Crews worked at mopping up hotspots, securing the line that has already established and patrolling looking for any issues that could impact the fire area. Today's plan is pretty much the same.

We know you are getting anxious to get back into the park and recreate but there is still a lot of fire in the interior but as the temperatures drop and the humidity rises there will be less and less. Be advised that this fire will not be totally out until the rains start.

Please stay out of the fire area. Be vigilant while you are driving, the fog is adding to the other hazards. Watch out for firefighter vehicles and equipment. Slow down, be patient and drive safely.
