INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

**Between the
U.S. GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION,
PUBLIC BUILDINGS SERVICE
and the
U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,
NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,
NATIONAL MALL AND MEMORIAL PARKS**

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Interagency Agreement between the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) and the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, National Mall and Memorial Parks (NPS) is to carry out the obligations of GSA and NPS (Parties, each individually, Party) as defined in Section 4 of Public Law 98-1, 97 Stat. 4 (Feb. 15, 1983)(the Act), which directed GSA to "...execute an agreement with the Secretary of the Interior providing for operation of the observation tower...by the National Park Service and further providing...for transfer to the National Park Service...such sums as may be necessary to operate the observation tower." The Old Post Office Tower (Tower) is listed on the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to 54 U.S.C. Chapter 3021, and is a primary element in the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. The tower is part of the Old Post Office Building (OPO), which is located on the southeast corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 12th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. In August 2013, a 60-year ground lease was signed between GSA and the Trump Organization to redevelop the OPO and operate it as a hotel.

II. Roles

GSA administers the OPO Building and leases it to the Trump Organization, which has the primary responsibility for the overall management of the OPO Building pursuant to the ground lease referenced above. The NPS is solely responsible for providing visitor services for the Tower, as described below.

III. Responsibilities

The Parties mutually agree:

1. The Tower shall be operated in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Act, this Agreement, and the annual NPS Operations Plan and Budget (Plan and Budget) described below.
2. Any operational concerns regarding the Tower noted by either Party shall be brought to the attention of the other Party and shall be resolved in a timely and mutually acceptable manner. Both parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve any concerns and cooperate in good faith.

A. NPS will provide:

1. Education and interpretation services for visitors to the Tower. The GSA and NPS shall mutually agree upon the hours and operational conditions of the Tower in the

- annual Plan and Budget, described below. GSA will not require NPS to host, plan, or staff any special events or alter its normal operations to accommodate any hotel special events. Any special events allowed by GSA or its lessee should not impact the normal business operations of the Tower nor should the NPS incur any additional expenses such as overtime to accommodate them. Special events will not be allowed in the NPS office areas, only in the visitor areas of the OPO Tower.
2. Identification of any additional design needs for the visitor spaces on the ground, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower.
 3. Proposed modifications, alterations, and construction plans for space alterations to GSA for review and written approval to ensure the integrity of the historical character of the Tower and its fixtures.
 4. An annual Plan and Budget to be submitted to GSA by each July 15th for the following fiscal year. The Plan and Budget will be reviewed and approved by GSA by September 1st for the following fiscal year's operation and attached following the last page of this agreement. Any modification to the Plan and Budget must be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties. Upon enactment of GSA's appropriation, operating funds will be transferred to the NPS/NAMA within 30 days per section "VI. Funding".
 - a. The Plan and Budget will provide:
 - i. Proposals and estimated costs for exhibits or other visual aids to interpret key themes of the site such as planning and development of the Nation's Capital; the L'Enfant Plan; Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site; historic places, national landmarks, and cityscape; historic preservation; the OPO Building and Tower; and the Ditchley Bells of Congress;
 - ii. Operational staffing needs and costs;
 - iii. Hours of operation; and,
 - iv. A plan for potential volunteer services and/or partnerships to support NPS operations.
 - b. Each fiscal year's Plan and Budget shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference
 - c. Public information services for the NPS activities in the Tower.
 5. Coordination with the Washington Ringing Society for the ringing of the Ditchley Bells of Congress on holidays and on special occasions, as well as weekly practice sessions.
 6. Reasonable notice of all activities of the NPS at the Tower that may affect GSA or the Trump Organization.
 7. Visitor and staff safety in a manner consistent with NPS safety and management policies, in areas assigned to NPS at the Tower. This will include following the 25-person maximum occupancy limit for the Tower.
 8. Coordination with GSA contractors providing services relating to the Tower, consistent with NPS management responsibility.

9. An Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-operated space to be approved by GSA.
10. Notice when NPS elects to furnish services or events outside the scope of this agreement.

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative

determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

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PUBLIC BUILDINGS SERVICE

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative

determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Interagency Agreement between the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) and the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, National Mall and Memorial Parks (NPS) is to carry out the obligations of GSA and NPS (Parties, each individually, Party) as defined in Section 4 of Public Law 98-1, 97 Stat. 4 (Feb. 15, 1983)(the Act), which directed GSA to "...execute an agreement with the Secretary of the Interior providing for operation of the observation tower...by the National Park Service and further providing...for transfer to the National Park Service...such sums as may be necessary to operate the observation tower." The Old Post Office Tower (Tower) is listed on the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to 54 U.S.C. Chapter 3021, and is a primary element in the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. The tower is part of the Old Post Office Building (OPO), which is located on the southeast corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 12th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. In August 2013, a 60-year ground lease was signed between GSA and the Trump Organization to redevelop the OPO and operate it as a hotel.

II. Roles

GSA administers the OPO Building and leases it to the Trump Organization, which has the primary responsibility for the overall management of the OPO Building pursuant to the ground lease referenced above. The NPS is solely responsible for providing visitor services for the Tower, as described below.

III. Responsibilities

The Parties mutually agree:

1. The Tower shall be operated in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Act, this Agreement, and the annual NPS Operations Plan and Budget (Plan and Budget) described below.
2. Any operational concerns regarding the Tower noted by either Party shall be brought to the attention of the other Party and shall be resolved in a timely and mutually acceptable manner. Both parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve any concerns and cooperate in good faith.

A. NPS will provide:

1. Education and interpretation services for visitors to the Tower. The GSA and NPS shall mutually agree upon the hours and operational conditions of the Tower in the

- annual Plan and Budget, described below. GSA will not require NPS to host, plan, or staff any special events or alter its normal operations to accommodate any hotel special events. Any special events allowed by GSA or its lessee should not impact the normal business operations of the Tower nor should the NPS incur any additional expenses such as overtime to accommodate them. Special events will not be allowed in the NPS office areas, only in the visitor areas of the OPO Tower.
2. Identification of any additional design needs for the visitor spaces on the ground, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower.
 3. Proposed modifications, alterations, and construction plans for space alterations to GSA for review and written approval to ensure the integrity of the historical character of the Tower and its fixtures.
 4. An annual Plan and Budget to be submitted to GSA by each July 15th for the following fiscal year. The Plan and Budget will be reviewed and approved by GSA by September 1st for the following fiscal year's operation and attached following the last page of this agreement. Any modification to the Plan and Budget must be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties. Upon enactment of GSA's appropriation, operating funds will be transferred to the NPS/NAMA within 30 days per section "VI. Funding".
 - a. The Plan and Budget will provide:
 - i. Proposals and estimated costs for exhibits or other visual aids to interpret key themes of the site such as planning and development of the Nation's Capital; the L'Enfant Plan; Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site; historic places, national landmarks, and cityscape; historic preservation; the OPO Building and Tower; and the Ditchley Bells of Congress;
 - ii. Operational staffing needs and costs;
 - iii. Hours of operation; and,
 - iv. A plan for potential volunteer services and/or partnerships to support NPS operations.
 - b. Each fiscal year's Plan and Budget shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference
 - c. Public information services for the NPS activities in the Tower.
 5. Coordination with the Washington Ringing Society for the ringing of the Ditchley Bells of Congress on holidays and on special occasions, as well as weekly practice sessions.
 6. Reasonable notice of all activities of the NPS at the Tower that may affect GSA or the Trump Organization.
 7. Visitor and staff safety in a manner consistent with NPS safety and management policies, in areas assigned to NPS at the Tower. This will include following the 25-person maximum occupancy limit for the Tower.
 8. Coordination with GSA contractors providing services relating to the Tower, consistent with NPS management responsibility.

9. An Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-operated space to be approved by GSA.
10. Notice when NPS elects to furnish services or events outside the scope of this agreement.

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative

determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

**Between the
U.S. GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION,
PUBLIC BUILDINGS SERVICE
and the
U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,
NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,
NATIONAL MALL AND MEMORIAL PARKS**

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Interagency Agreement between the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) and the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, National Mall and Memorial Parks (NPS) is to carry out the obligations of GSA and NPS (Parties, each individually, Party) as defined in Section 4 of Public Law 98-1, 97 Stat. 4 (Feb. 15, 1983)(the Act), which directed GSA to "...execute an agreement with the Secretary of the Interior providing for operation of the observation tower...by the National Park Service and further providing...for transfer to the National Park Service...such sums as may be necessary to operate the observation tower." The Old Post Office Tower (Tower) is listed on the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to 54 U.S.C. Chapter 3021, and is a primary element in the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. The tower is part of the Old Post Office Building (OPO), which is located on the southeast corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 12th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. In August 2013, a 60-year ground lease was signed between GSA and the Trump Organization to redevelop the OPO and operate it as a hotel.

II. Roles

GSA administers the OPO Building and leases it to the Trump Organization, which has the primary responsibility for the overall management of the OPO Building pursuant to the ground lease referenced above. The NPS is solely responsible for providing visitor services for the Tower, as described below.

III. Responsibilities

The Parties mutually agree:

1. The Tower shall be operated in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Act, this Agreement, and the annual NPS Operations Plan and Budget (Plan and Budget) described below.
2. Any operational concerns regarding the Tower noted by either Party shall be brought to the attention of the other Party and shall be resolved in a timely and mutually acceptable manner. Both parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve any concerns and cooperate in good faith.

A. NPS will provide:

1. Education and interpretation services for visitors to the Tower. The GSA and NPS shall mutually agree upon the hours and operational conditions of the Tower in the

- annual Plan and Budget, described below. GSA will not require NPS to host, plan, or staff any special events or alter its normal operations to accommodate any hotel special events. Any special events allowed by GSA or its lessee should not impact the normal business operations of the Tower nor should the NPS incur any additional expenses such as overtime to accommodate them. Special events will not be allowed in the NPS office areas, only in the visitor areas of the OPO Tower.
2. Identification of any additional design needs for the visitor spaces on the ground, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower.
 3. Proposed modifications, alterations, and construction plans for space alterations to GSA for review and written approval to ensure the integrity of the historical character of the Tower and its fixtures.
 4. An annual Plan and Budget to be submitted to GSA by each July 15th for the following fiscal year. The Plan and Budget will be reviewed and approved by GSA by September 1st for the following fiscal year's operation and attached following the last page of this agreement. Any modification to the Plan and Budget must be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties. Upon enactment of GSA's appropriation, operating funds will be transferred to the NPS/NAMA within 30 days per section "VI. Funding".
 - a. The Plan and Budget will provide:
 - i. Proposals and estimated costs for exhibits or other visual aids to interpret key themes of the site such as planning and development of the Nation's Capital; the L'Enfant Plan; Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site; historic places, national landmarks, and cityscape; historic preservation; the OPO Building and Tower; and the Ditchley Bells of Congress;
 - ii. Operational staffing needs and costs;
 - iii. Hours of operation; and,
 - iv. A plan for potential volunteer services and/or partnerships to support NPS operations.
 - b. Each fiscal year's Plan and Budget shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference
 - c. Public information services for the NPS activities in the Tower.
 5. Coordination with the Washington Ringing Society for the ringing of the Ditchley Bells of Congress on holidays and on special occasions, as well as weekly practice sessions.
 6. Reasonable notice of all activities of the NPS at the Tower that may affect GSA or the Trump Organization.
 7. Visitor and staff safety in a manner consistent with NPS safety and management policies, in areas assigned to NPS at the Tower. This will include following the 25-person maximum occupancy limit for the Tower.
 8. Coordination with GSA contractors providing services relating to the Tower, consistent with NPS management responsibility.

9. An Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-operated space to be approved by GSA.
10. Notice when NPS elects to furnish services or events outside the scope of this agreement.

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative

determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

The Plan and Budget will be reviewed and approved by GSA by September 1st for the following fiscal year's operation and attached following the last page of this agreement. Any modification to the Plan and Budget must be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties. Upon enactment of GSA's appropriation, operating funds will be transferred to the NPS/NAMA within 30 days per section "VI. Funding".
 - a. The Plan and Budget will provide:
 - i. Proposals and estimated costs for exhibits or other visual aids to interpret key themes of the site such as planning and development of the Nation's Capital; the L'Enfant Plan; Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site; historic places, national landmarks, and cityscape; historic preservation; the OPO Building and Tower; and the Ditchley Bells of Congress;
 - ii. Operational staffing needs and costs;
 - iii. Hours of operation; and,
 - iv. A plan for potential volunteer services and/or partnerships to support NPS operations.
 - b. Each fiscal year's Plan and Budget shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference
 - c. Public information services for the NPS activities in the Tower.
 5. Coordination with the Washington Ringing Society for the ringing of the Ditchley Bells of Congress on holidays and on special occasions, as well as weekly practice sessions.
 6. Reasonable notice of all activities of the NPS at the Tower that may affect GSA or the Trump Organization.
 7. Visitor and staff safety in a manner consistent with NPS safety and management policies, in areas assigned to NPS at the Tower. This will include following the 25-person maximum occupancy limit for the Tower.
 8. Coordination with GSA contractors providing services relating to the Tower, consistent with NPS management responsibility.

9. An Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-operated space to be approved by GSA.
10. Notice when NPS elects to furnish services or events outside the scope of this agreement.

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative

determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

**Between the
U.S. GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION,
PUBLIC BUILDINGS SERVICE
and the
U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,
NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,
NATIONAL MALL AND MEMORIAL PARKS**

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Interagency Agreement between the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) and the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, National Mall and Memorial Parks (NPS) is to carry out the obligations of GSA and NPS (Parties, each individually, Party) as defined in Section 4 of Public Law 98-1, 97 Stat. 4 (Feb. 15, 1983)(the Act), which directed GSA to "...execute an agreement with the Secretary of the Interior providing for operation of the observation tower...by the National Park Service and further providing...for transfer to the National Park Service...such sums as may be necessary to operate the observation tower." The Old Post Office Tower (Tower) is listed on the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to 54 U.S.C. Chapter 3021, and is a primary element in the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. The tower is part of the Old Post Office Building (OPO), which is located on the southeast corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 12th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. In August 2013, a 60-year ground lease was signed between GSA and the Trump Organization to redevelop the OPO and operate it as a hotel.

II. Roles

GSA administers the OPO Building and leases it to the Trump Organization, which has the primary responsibility for the overall management of the OPO Building pursuant to the ground lease referenced above. The NPS is solely responsible for providing visitor services for the Tower, as described below.

III. Responsibilities

The Parties mutually agree:

1. The Tower shall be operated in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Act, this Agreement, and the annual NPS Operations Plan and Budget (Plan and Budget) described below.
2. Any operational concerns regarding the Tower noted by either Party shall be brought to the attention of the other Party and shall be resolved in a timely and mutually acceptable manner. Both parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve any concerns and cooperate in good faith.

A. NPS will provide:

1. Education and interpretation services for visitors to the Tower. The GSA and NPS shall mutually agree upon the hours and operational conditions of the Tower in the

- annual Plan and Budget, described below. GSA will not require NPS to host, plan, or staff any special events or alter its normal operations to accommodate any hotel special events. Any special events allowed by GSA or its lessee should not impact the normal business operations of the Tower nor should the NPS incur any additional expenses such as overtime to accommodate them. Special events will not be allowed in the NPS office areas, only in the visitor areas of the OPO Tower.
2. Identification of any additional design needs for the visitor spaces on the ground, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower.
 3. Proposed modifications, alterations, and construction plans for space alterations to GSA for review and written approval to ensure the integrity of the historical character of the Tower and its fixtures.
 4. An annual Plan and Budget to be submitted to GSA by each July 15th for the following fiscal year. The Plan and Budget will be reviewed and approved by GSA by September 1st for the following fiscal year's operation and attached following the last page of this agreement. Any modification to the Plan and Budget must be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties. Upon enactment of GSA's appropriation, operating funds will be transferred to the NPS/NAMA within 30 days per section "VI. Funding".
 - a. The Plan and Budget will provide:
 - i. Proposals and estimated costs for exhibits or other visual aids to interpret key themes of the site such as planning and development of the Nation's Capital; the L'Enfant Plan; Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site; historic places, national landmarks, and cityscape; historic preservation; the OPO Building and Tower; and the Ditchley Bells of Congress;
 - ii. Operational staffing needs and costs;
 - iii. Hours of operation; and,
 - iv. A plan for potential volunteer services and/or partnerships to support NPS operations.
 - b. Each fiscal year's Plan and Budget shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference
 - c. Public information services for the NPS activities in the Tower.
 5. Coordination with the Washington Ringing Society for the ringing of the Ditchley Bells of Congress on holidays and on special occasions, as well as weekly practice sessions.
 6. Reasonable notice of all activities of the NPS at the Tower that may affect GSA or the Trump Organization.
 7. Visitor and staff safety in a manner consistent with NPS safety and management policies, in areas assigned to NPS at the Tower. This will include following the 25-person maximum occupancy limit for the Tower.
 8. Coordination with GSA contractors providing services relating to the Tower, consistent with NPS management responsibility.

9. An Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-operated space to be approved by GSA.
10. Notice when NPS elects to furnish services or events outside the scope of this agreement.

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative


determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT

**Between the
U.S. GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION,
PUBLIC BUILDINGS SERVICE
and the
U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,
NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,
NATIONAL MALL AND MEMORIAL PARKS**

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Interagency Agreement between the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) and the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, National Mall and Memorial Parks (NPS) is to carry out the obligations of GSA and NPS (Parties, each individually, Party) as defined in Section 4 of Public Law 98-1, 97 Stat. 4 (Feb. 15, 1983)(the Act), which directed GSA to "...execute an agreement with the Secretary of the Interior providing for operation of the observation tower...by the National Park Service and further providing...for transfer to the National Park Service...such sums as may be necessary to operate the observation tower." The Old Post Office Tower (Tower) is listed on the National Register of Historic Places pursuant to 54 U.S.C. Chapter 3021, and is a primary element in the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. The tower is part of the Old Post Office Building (OPO), which is located on the southeast corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 12th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. In August 2013, a 60-year ground lease was signed between GSA and the Trump Organization to redevelop the OPO and operate it as a hotel.

II. Roles

GSA administers the OPO Building and leases it to the Trump Organization, which has the primary responsibility for the overall management of the OPO Building pursuant to the ground lease referenced above. The NPS is solely responsible for providing visitor services for the Tower, as described below.

III. Responsibilities

The Parties mutually agree:

1. The Tower shall be operated in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Act, this Agreement, and the annual NPS Operations Plan and Budget (Plan and Budget) described below.
2. Any operational concerns regarding the Tower noted by either Party shall be brought to the attention of the other Party and shall be resolved in a timely and mutually acceptable manner. Both parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve any concerns and cooperate in good faith.

A. NPS will provide:

1. Education and interpretation services for visitors to the Tower. The GSA and NPS shall mutually agree upon the hours and operational conditions of the Tower in the

- annual Plan and Budget, described below. GSA will not require NPS to host, plan, or staff any special events or alter its normal operations to accommodate any hotel special events. Any special events allowed by GSA or its lessee should not impact the normal business operations of the Tower nor should the NPS incur any additional expenses such as overtime to accommodate them. Special events will not be allowed in the NPS office areas, only in the visitor areas of the OPO Tower.
2. Identification of any additional design needs for the visitor spaces on the ground, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower.
 3. Proposed modifications, alterations, and construction plans for space alterations to GSA for review and written approval to ensure the integrity of the historical character of the Tower and its fixtures.
 4. An annual Plan and Budget to be submitted to GSA by each July 15th for the following fiscal year. The Plan and Budget will be reviewed and approved by GSA by September 1st for the following fiscal year's operation and attached following the last page of this agreement. Any modification to the Plan and Budget must be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Parties. Upon enactment of GSA's appropriation, operating funds will be transferred to the NPS/NAMA within 30 days per section "VI. Funding".
 - a. The Plan and Budget will provide:
 - i. Proposals and estimated costs for exhibits or other visual aids to interpret key themes of the site such as planning and development of the Nation's Capital; the L'Enfant Plan; Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site; historic places, national landmarks, and cityscape; historic preservation; the OPO Building and Tower; and the Ditchley Bells of Congress;
 - ii. Operational staffing needs and costs;
 - iii. Hours of operation; and,
 - iv. A plan for potential volunteer services and/or partnerships to support NPS operations.
 - b. Each fiscal year's Plan and Budget shall be deemed to be incorporated into this Agreement by reference
 - c. Public information services for the NPS activities in the Tower.
 5. Coordination with the Washington Ringing Society for the ringing of the Ditchley Bells of Congress on holidays and on special occasions, as well as weekly practice sessions.
 6. Reasonable notice of all activities of the NPS at the Tower that may affect GSA or the Trump Organization.
 7. Visitor and staff safety in a manner consistent with NPS safety and management policies, in areas assigned to NPS at the Tower. This will include following the 25-person maximum occupancy limit for the Tower.
 8. Coordination with GSA contractors providing services relating to the Tower, consistent with NPS management responsibility.

9. An Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-operated space to be approved by GSA.
10. Notice when NPS elects to furnish services or events outside the scope of this agreement.

B. GSA will provide:

1. Finished spaces in the ground floor waiting area, the 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Tower including adequate public access (including access for those with disabilities) to elevator facilities to all levels, as well as equipment necessary for the presentation of approved NPS activities related to the Old Post Office Building and Tower and the Pennsylvania Avenue National Historic Site. GSA agrees to future improvements of the finishes for the public spaces on the 9th floor as funding is available, to the extent consistent with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties and permitted under the Programmatic Agreement entered into between GSA, NPS, and other parties on May 23, 2013, pursuant to Sections 106, 110, and 111 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. §§ 306108, 306107, 306121, and 306122.

Recommended finishes include the following:

- a. all hallways from the 9th floor elevator entrance through the hall/balcony area in and around the bell ringer space and back hall areas will include a 12"x24" tile in running bond pattern by Dal-Tile, Invoke Colorbody Porcelain, Sheer Glow ID01 with matching grout;
 - b. the bell ringer platform to have a 24" border around the entire platform of the same floor tile, and a carpet insert by Mohawk Group, Bending earth line, Caliber tile, color Feldspar – 7858;
 - c. base trim in these spaces shall be a wood base, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Baseboard #163E - 9/16" x 5-1/4" throughout; door and window casing shall be wood, one-piece of similar profile to Smoot Lumber Company Adams Casing #97 - 1-1/16" x 3-1/2".
2. Design recommendations and approvals for any modifications to the visitor spaces in the waiting area on the ground floor, 9th, 10th, and 12th floors of the Old Post Office Tower. Such recommendations may be submitted to the NPS for review and comment.
 3. The NPS operation and staffing funds as agreed to in the Plan and Budget. This amount will be agreed to by the Superintendent of National Mall and Memorial Parks each year preceding the beginning of the affected fiscal year and will be documented by GSA.
 4. Maintenance services including elevator maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of space and audiovisual equipment in all areas assigned to the NPS, lighting, electrical, plumbing, painting, and miscellaneous fit and finish needs and all outside signs at no expense to the NPS. These services and repairs shall be completed in a timely manner so as not to affect the operation of the Tower. Any

mutually agreed-upon exceptions must be funded through the Plan and Budget.

5. Janitorial services for NPS occupied office and visitor spaces to include trash pickup, vacuuming, sweeping, restroom cleaning, etc.
6. All utility services (electricity, heat, air conditioning, water, local phone services and a reasonable cost of long distance services), reasonably necessary for NPS operations in accordance with agreed-upon services.
7. Public restrooms on the ground floor accessible to all visitors, including those with disabilities, and provisions for emergency public restroom use by visitors or NPS/staff in the 9th floor NPS space.
8. Reasonable notice of all activities GSA is aware of that may affect NPS activities at the Tower.
9. The identification of cost effective measures, mutually agreed upon by both parties, for providing Tower services to ensure continued public services and access.
10. The design, construction, and installation of interpretive exhibits for the visually impaired visitors and will manage the contracting requirements and coordinate with the NPS on content and design.
11. Assistance to NPS, as needed, in collaborating with the Trump Organization on the building-wide Occupant Emergency Plan and the Occupant Emergency Plan for the NPS-specific space.
12. Security services for the NPS-occupied Clock Tower space.
13. GSA shall comply with 36 CFR part 1191, Appendices C and D (Architectural Barriers Act Chapters 1 and 2, and Chapters 3 through 10) to provide a fully accessible or approved alternative visitor experience throughout the Tower. During the term of this agreement GSA will complete an independent feasibility study to examine the modification or removal of the tiered concrete structure on the 12th floor to bring the observation tower into compliance. GSA will also produce and make publicly available a video about the tower experience to be installed with the exhibits, for visitors with accessibility needs who cannot access the observation tower. GSA will share the results of the feasibility study with NPS.

GSA shall comply with all emergency egress requirements throughout the Old Post Office Tower, including the public and staff spaces. GSA agrees to ensure necessary modifications are made to areas that do not currently meet the egress requirements of National Fire Protection Association 101 - The Life Safety Code, or GSA shall provide alternate means and methods to meet the intent of the Life Safety Code as approved by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (GSA Fire Protection Engineering Team).

IV. Term of Agreement

This agreement will commence on the date of the last signature affixed by GSA or NPS and will remain in effect until September 30, 2019, at which time the Agreement may be renewed upon the written agreement of both Parties, such writing to contain the new term and be attached to this Agreement. Consistent with the provisions of the Act, or any other superseding law or regulation, either Party may terminate this agreement upon 90-day notification to the other Party.

V. Assignment

No transfer or assignment of this Agreement, or of any part thereof or interest therein, directly or indirectly, voluntarily or involuntarily, shall be made unless such transfer or assignment is first approved in writing by the Parties.

VI. Funding

Pursuant to Part III, Responsibilities (A)(4) of the agreement, the approved annual operating plan provides funding for fiscal year 2019. Funding will be transferred via a 7600B, United States Government Interagency Agreement Form, to NPS and is not provided in advance of expenditures. Expenditures charged toward this agreement will not exceed the approved annual operating plan. If expenditures are projected to exceed the originally approved annual operating plan, a modification to the annual operating plan will be submitted by NPS to GSA for concurrence.

Due to continuing resolution constraints, funding will be provided by GSA to NPS on a periodic basis using the form 7600B. This document will be used for the justification and transfer of funds and expenditures between parties for the period of time listed on the 7600B, section 27, and funding provided for in the same period, not to exceed the approved annual operating plan for the applicable fiscal year.

VII. Accounting and Billing

Accounting: Accounting information will be provided in the 7600B, section 28 with reference to the Agency Location Code, Treasury Account Symbol, ordering activity DUNS code, and supplemental accounting information.

Billing: Billing information will be provided in the form 7600B, sections 32 through 34. Expenditures will cease to be collected 6 months after the fiscal year due to administrative changes in expenditures from the applicable fiscal year in which they were charged are made.

VIII. Liability

Each Party agrees to assume responsibility for any and all claims resulting from the acts or omissions of its employees or representatives, to the greatest extent permitted by law. In the event a claim is brought under the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 *et seq.*, (FTCA), it shall be the responsibility of the Party receiving the claim to coordinate with the other Party regarding responsibility to investigate any such claim, to issue an administrative


determination as required by the FTCA, and to assist in the defense of any litigation arising from any such claim, and the other Party to cooperate in this effort.

IX. General

1. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the United States to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress for the purpose of this Agreement for that fiscal year, or to involve the United States in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations.
2. No Member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of any contract or agreement made, entered into, or accepted by or on behalf of the United States, or to any benefit to arise thereupon.
3. GSA and NPS agree that the term "days", as used in this Agreement, means Federal business days.
4. GSA and NPS agree to provide contact information, updated annually, for key contacts in both organizations, including those staff who are responsible for operation and maintenance of the tower. Each Party will include as key contacts those managers who are able to make decisions and support resolution of disputes related to operation and maintenance of the Tower.

Ms. Cook: the IAA signed between GSA and NPS last week provided funding for 3 months @ \$48015.92/month, for a total of \$144,047.76. NPS has been operating the tower for the full quarter (Oct. 1, 2018-Dec. 31, 2018), with a one week gap (12/21-12/28) due to the government shutdown. Thus we expect to bill for the full amount available by 1/5/19. I spoke with Mr. Finch this past Monday, requesting that we have a conversation with your budget folks and figure out where we are moving forward. We will be unable to provide NPS staffing past this coming Friday, 1/5/19, without an additional order of funds for the IAA. I hope that we will be able to speak first thing in the morning, 1/2/19. President Trump's last-minute demands for billions in border wall funding triggered the partial federal government shutdown that closed national parks and facilities late last month — but his namesake hotel in the nation's capital will see its own National Park Service site reopen this week.

The Old Post Office Tower, which shares facilities with the Trump International Hotel on Pennsylvania Avenue, is slated to reopen by Friday thanks to funding from the General Services Administration.

GSA owns the facility, which once served as the headquarters of the U.S. Post Office. The agency inked a 60-year lease with the Trump Organization in 2013 to open a hotel on the site, including maintaining public access to the 270-foot observation tower.

The National Park Service provides interpretative programming at the site, which includes self-guided tours and an exhibit area.

Access to the tower closed Dec. 22 when Congress failed to reach agreement on funding for agencies including the Interior Department.

An Interior spokesman said the agency vowed to maintain access to "iconic areas," but that apparently did not include the Old Post Office site ([Greenwire](#), Dec. 26, 2018).

NPS chief spokesman Jeremy Barnum last week declined to speculate on whether the Old Post Office Tower would be reopened but noted that the agency had signed more than 40 agreements — with concessionaires, partner organizations and state governments — to continue operations at parks and other sites.

"The extent of services and duration varies by agreement," Barnum said in an email.

Those agreements range from Guest Services Inc. providing portable toilets on the National Mall to Xanterra Parks and Resorts paying for the grooming of roads in Yellowstone National Park.

Both the Utah and New York state governments have also provided funding to maintain national parks and monuments inside their borders.

According to Utah Office of Tourism Associate Managing Director Jay Kinghorn, his state paid nearly \$55,000 to provide visitor center and janitorial services at Arches, Bryce Canyon and Zion national parks between Dec. 22 and Dec. 31, 2018.

Similarly, New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo (D) said last month that the Empire State would pay about \$65,000 per day to open the Statue of Liberty National Monument and Ellis Island.

GSA did not detail how much it will cost to cover operations at the Old Post Office Tower.

According to the NPS contingency plans for a budget lapse, individual park units can enter into agreements with "local governments, cooperating associations and/or other third parties" to continue "specified visitor services."

It is not clear whether the Trump Organization attempted to pay to reopen the facility itself. Multiple telephone calls and emails to representatives of Trump Hotels were not returned.

According to the GSA [lease](#) for the facility, while Trump Hotels must maintain public access to the tower, the business is responsible for the entire Post Office site.

"For the avoidance of doubt, the Clock Tower Space is part of the Premises ... for which Tenant is responsible," the lease states.

In the meantime, the Washington Ringing Society will mark the start of the 116th Congress tomorrow by raising the historic Congress Bells inside the tower at 7 p.m.

"Because this is a performance outside of National Park Service hours, visitors in the ringing room are not permitted, but the bells can be heard by the public from outside the Old Post Office Tower," said Ringing Master Robert Bannister.

The Old Post Office tower, which shares facilities with the Trump International Hotel in Washington, D.C., will remain open during a partial government shutdown.

The General Services Administration (GSA), an independent government agency which owns the facility, is providing the funding to keep the tower open.

“The referenced facility remains open as the funds needed to operate the Old Post Office tower are not associated with the current fiscal year's (FY 2019) appropriations bill. The overall operation of the tower was a part of the government’s lease signed in August 2013, and in response to the ‘Old Post Office Building Redevelopment Act of 2008,’” a GSA spokesperson said in a statement to The Hill Thursday.

The statement came in response to a request for comment on a [report from E&E News](#) that said the tower would be reopening and left it unclear how the funding to reopen the tower was procured.

The GSA signed a deal with the Trump organization in 2013 to build the hotel and maintain public access to the 270-foot observation tower. The

lease for the tower mandates that the Trump Organization is responsible for the entire Old Post Office site.

Rep. [Bill Pascrell, Jr.](#) (D-N.J.) denounced the Trump administration on Twitter, accusing it of improperly using tax dollars to benefit the president's business.

"The Trump admin is using your tax dollars to keep an @NPS site at his luxury hotel open while the rest of Americans are wading through garbage and locked gates. The corruption and disgrace of this govt are without bottom," he tweeted Wednesday.

The National Park Service has signed over forty agreements since the lapse in appropriations with a number of concessioners, partner organizations, and states to provide various visitor services at a number of national parks. The extent of services and duration varies by agreement.

Background Information/Examples

Note that some of these initial donations are for relatively short portions of time, and may or may not extend for the duration of a shutdown.

Guest Services, Inc. has provided portable toilets for the National Mall.

The Friends of Vicksburg National Military Park and Campaign have donated the necessary funds to provide for essential services at Vicksburg National Military Park during the shutdown.

Xanterra Parks and Resorts is providing funding for the grooming of oversnow roads at Yellowstone National Park during the shutdown.

The California Department of Parks and Recreation has made an in-kind donation to provide for the cleaning of restrooms and trash removal at Redwoods National and State Parks.

The State of New York is providing funding to operate the Statue of Liberty National Monument.

The Utah Office of Tourism is providing funding to staff visitor centers and custodial services at Arches, Bryce Canyon, and Zion National Parks.

At the superintendent's discretion and with approval of the Regional Director or Director, parks may enter into arrangements with local governments, cooperating associations, and/or other third parties (see below for concessioners and Commercial Use Authorization holders) for donation of specified visitor services. The NPS will not reimburse third parties (through payments, franchise fee relief or any other consideration) who provide such visitor services. If NPS staff will be conducting the work using funds from a third party, funds must be transferred and deposited before the NPS may continue or resume providing visitor services. The Washington Office will provide template agreements. Agreements should not be established for a period of less than three days. Because a shutdown of park operations may take up to two days, parks should begin shutdown when the balance in the donation account falls below a two-day balance.





Here's the statement we've been using for OPOT; I think it works for the staff as well:

"The National Park Service staffs the tower tour at the Old Post Office under an interagency agreement with the General Services Administration, which owns the building and provides funding for the NPS personnel."

If someone presses them on why the site is open while parks are closed or where the money is coming from, staff should refer those inquiries to GSA:

"Operational details, including dates of operation, are established by GSA; please contact GSA for additional Information about the property."

As for whether they are getting paid, unlike the rest of the NPS employees, those working at OPOT are guaranteed to be paid for shutdown (at least the time they worked), unlike their furloughed counterparts. However, it won't happen until the shutdown is over. The funding agreement with GSA does not cover timekeepers and administrative staff that are needed to process their pay.

Shutdown spares federal park rangers at site in Trump hotel

WASHINGTON (AP) — Smithsonian museums are closed. There are no federal staffers to answer tourists' questions at the Lincoln Memorial. And across the United States, national parks are cluttered with trash. Yet despite the federal government shutdown, a historic clock tower at the Trump International Hotel remained open Friday for its handful of visitors, staffed by green-clad National Park Service rangers.

"We're open!" one National Park Service ranger declared around lunchtime, pushing an elevator button for a lone visitor entering the site through a side entrance to ride to the top of the 315-foot-high, nearly 120-year-old clock tower.

The Trump administration appears to have gone out of its way to keep the attraction in the federally owned building that houses the Trump hotel open and staffed with National Park Service rangers, even as other federal agencies shut all but the most essential services.

Amanda Osborn, a spokeswoman for the General Services Administration, which owns the building and leases it to the Trump Organization, said in an email that the shutdown exemption for the comparatively little-known clock tower was "unrelated to the facility's tenant" — the Trump business. The agency says the law that put it in charge of the site obligates it to keep it open, even as federal Washington closes around it.

But the scene at the modest historic site at the Trump hotel building, where rangers often outnumber visitors, marked the latest episode in which Trump's business interests have overlapped with the work of the federal government, creating at least the appearance of a conflict of interest.

A watchdog group, and frustrated tourists, questioned why a shutdown that had furloughed hundreds of thousands of workers and crippled many agencies was exempting a site within the Trump family's business empire. The shutdown began Dec. 22, born out of an impasse between congressional Democrats and President

Donald Trump over funding for a southern border wall.

Shutdown plans at the Interior Department, which includes the park service, mandated idling all but the most essential staff.

A watchdog group, Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington, filed a Freedom of Information Act request with the GSA, seeking documents explaining why the tower was open, how it continues to be funded, and any communications between the agency and the Trump Organization, the president's company. Trump gave up day-to-day management of the firm in 2017 but continues to receive earnings from its operations.

"At the very least, this smells funny." Said Noah Bookbinder, the group's executive director.

"We have not seen a satisfactory basis for why one park service property is opened when no others are," Bookbinder said. "This raises tremendous questions about whether this property that intersects with the president's business is getting special treatment."

CREW is also involved in a federal lawsuit targeting the Trump hotel that could become the first test of whether presidents are restricted by the U.S. Constitution's emoluments provision, which bans gifts from foreign and U.S. state governments to federal officials.

Completed in 1899, the Romanesque-style former post office is on the National Register of Historic Places. The GSA pays for the National Park Service to run the building's clock tower for visits by the general public. The tower initially closed to the public after the shutdown started. The GSA noticed then that the deal under which the park service staffs the site had expired, and renewed it, and the park service reopened the tower this week, the agency said.

The GSA, which helps other federal agencies operate, said it was using money from its building fund to keep the tower open and staffed.

Up at the top of the clock tower, a single tourist walked in during a 10-minute visit. She stared out the windows at some of the capital's best views.

With other federal sites closed to tourists or unstaffed in the shutdown, ranger Rob Lorenz said in the tower, business has been picking up "as tour operators figure it out."

A little more than a mile away at the Lincoln Memorial, a few hundred visitors hauled themselves up the stone steps and fell hushed as they wandered at the foot of the great statue of Abraham Lincoln. Husband and wife Kaicey and Neiman Manns, history buffs visiting from Roanoke, Virginia, expressed disappointment that Ford's Theater and the national archives were both out for them, on this trip.

Even though the clock tower was one of the few federal landmarks open and staffed in Washington, Neiman Manns said, he'd pass.

“Me personally, the Trump Hotel? I don’t see that as a real part of the history of the United States,” he said.

Anna Menezes, a newly arrived tourist from Maringa, Brazil, wasn’t aware of the shutdown and wondered why federal museums were closed and the memorial unstaffed.

Told she could visit the tower at the Trump hotel, Menezes arched an eyebrow.

“Interesting,” she said.

Hi Mike,

I stopped by the observation tower at the Old Post Office yesterday and was told you were the person to talk to about National Park Service staffing of the site.

I'm trying to figure out who made the decision to keep the observation tower open during the shutdown? Some media outlets are implying that it's being kept open because it's at the president's hotel, and the administration is giving this site special treatment.

The GSA, of course, countered this and pointed to the 1983 law that required the GSA to enter into an agreement with the Department of the Interior to staff the site.

But it looks like from the GSA's statement that the agreement was renewed during the shutdown. Can you confirm that? Why not wait until after?

Additionally, lawyers I've talked to believe that the GSA's 2013 agreement with the Trump Organization essentially lets the government off the hook for staffing the tower during a shutdown.

So if this is the case, why does it remain open?

When talking on-background to a NPS employee yesterday the source said that they're being

told "because the funds exist, we're open." If that's the full extent of it, it would be nice for someone to say that on-the-record.

Please let me know if you have any thoughts. If you have a counterpart at GSA you think I should talk to, that would also work. I haven't gotten very far emailing their general press contact.

I write to request information regarding National Park Service (NPS) staffing of the Old Post Office Tower (tower) located within the Trump International Hotel during the current government shutdown.

The Old Post Office is a historic building under lease by the General Services Administration (GSA) to the Trump Organization, which is required to permit public access to certain areas of the building, including the tower.¹ The tower was closed by the NPS on December 22, 2018, when funding lapsed for certain agencies including the GSA and the Department of Interior (DOI), of which the NPS is a part.² On January 2, 2019, it was reported that the tower would reopen with funding from GSA,³ and it did.⁴ When questioned about this funding, a GSA spokesperson described the funds for reopening the tower as “not associated with the current fis-

cal year's (FY 2019) appropriations bill."⁵ Subsequently, it was reported that GSA would tap the Federal Buildings Fund to pay to reopen and staff the tower with NPS employees under an inter-agency agreement between GSA and DOI, which GSA stated was pursuant to Public Law 98-1.⁶

I would like nothing more than to have all of our rangers and other federal civil servants back at work on behalf of the public. As the clock tower at Trump International Hotel in Washington stands open, staffed by NPS personnel, valuable public buildings such as the Smithsonian are shuttered. Meanwhile, mounting trash and unsafe conditions at national park sites across the country are putting people and wildlife in jeopardy. At least three people have died at national park sites since the shutdown began.⁷ Conditions are being described as "dire" and on the brink of causing lasting damage and financial repercussions for parks and surrounding communities.⁸

While GSA has authority to transfer funds to NPS under certain conditions, the lengths to which to your agencies have gone to open the tower facility within a Trump business enterprise have raised public concerns that the tower may be receiving special treatment,⁹ in light of a shutdown that has left 800,000 federal workers furloughed or working without pay and crippled our national parks.

In order to better understand the current state of this matter and in light of the concerns outlined above, I request that you answer the following:

1. Please confirm the funding source for (1) the National Park Service employees, and (2) any other federal employees who are staffing the tower during the partial govern-

2. What other costs are GSA and/or DOI paying to keep the tower open and provide services, what is the funding source, and how much has been paid and/or obligated to date? Did GSA pay any of these costs prior to the shutdown?
3. What other federal facilities are currently being kept open during the shutdown using the same funding source(s) as the tower? What federal facilities have been closed during the shutdown? How did GSA make the decision as to how to allocate these funds among federal properties during this government shutdown, and why was the tower prioritized over other federal facilities?
4. Who made the decision to reopen the tower? Please confirm the authority under which it was reopened. What other facilities did GSA determine needed to be reopened after closing those facilities due to the lapse in funding?
5. What, if any, communications did GSA and/or DOI officials have with White House officials concerning the decision to reopen the tower and the funding to keep the tower open? With officials from any business entity affiliated with President Trump or his family?
6. Was the tower kept open to the public directly preceding, during, and/or after the October 2013 shutdown?
7. Please provide a copy of the current lease and any prior leases with the Trump Organization for the Trump International Hotel in Washington, DC, as well as a copy of the current interagency agreement between GSA and DOI and prior interagency agreements from 2010 to the present that cover staffing of the tower by NPS employees.

I request that you provide separate agency responses to the above questions on or before January 31, 2019. I write to request information regarding National Park Service (NPS) staffing of the Old Post Office Tower (tower) located within the Trump International Hotel during the current government shutdown.

The Old Post Office is a historic building under lease by the General Services Administration (GSA) to the Trump Organization, which is required to permit public access to certain areas of the building, including the tower.<sup>1</sup> The tower was closed by the NPS on December 22, 2018, when funding lapsed for certain agencies including the GSA and the Department of Interior (DOI), of which the NPS is a part.<sup>2</sup> On January 2, 2019, it was reported that the tower would reopen with funding from GSA,<sup>3</sup> and it did.<sup>4</sup> When questioned about this funding, a GSA spokesperson described the funds for reopening the tower as “not associated with the current fis-

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I would like nothing more than to have all of our rangers and other federal civil servants back at work on behalf of the public. As the clock tower at Trump International Hotel in Washington stands open, staffed by NPS personnel, valuable public buildings such as the Smithsonian are shuttered. Meanwhile, mounting trash and unsafe conditions at national park sites across the country are putting people and wildlife in jeopardy. At least three people have died at national park sites since the shutdown began.<sup>7</sup> Conditions are being described as "dire" and on the brink of causing lasting damage and financial repercussions for parks and surrounding communities.<sup>8</sup>

While GSA has authority to transfer funds to NPS under certain conditions, the lengths to which to your agencies have gone to open the tower facility within a Trump business enterprise have raised public concerns that the tower may be receiving special treatment,<sup>9</sup> in light of a shutdown that has left 800,000 federal workers furloughed or working without pay and crippled our national parks.
