Located along the Atlantic migratory flyway, Assateague Island plays host to a wide variety of both migratory and resident bird species. Because of its mid-latitude location within the migratory routes of both Northern and Southern species, the island provides a diversity of species throughout the year. The island's rich mosaic of beach, dune, forest and marsh habitats provides a home for a wide array of shorebirds, songbirds, raptors, waterfowl, and waders.

Whether hiking a nature trail, taking a stroll along the beach, or exploring the backcountry, Assateague can provide many memorable birding experiences.
