The Big South Fork National River and Recreation Area is rich in plant species. Many beautiful wildflowers grow along the trails and roadsides within the park. In order for you and other people to enjoy these flowers, we ask that you take only pictures and leave only footprints. While all species of plants are protected in the Big South Fork, some species of wildflowers are quite rare. It is prohibited to pick, dig, or collect flowers within the boundaries of the park. Please note that when searching for these beauties, weather conditions and topographic locations will alter blooming times.
