



## WELCOME OHV OPERATORS TO CITY OF ROCKS NATIONAL RESERVE CASTLE ROCKS STATE PARK



### OPPORTUNITIES AND RESTRICTIONS

Off-Highway vehicles (OHV), such as Utility Terrain Vehicles (UTV), all-terrain vehicles (ATV) and motorbikes are permitted on public roads within the Reserve and state park. Gated roads and /or roads signed as “Authorized Vehicles Only” are closed to OHV’s. OHV’s are not permitted off road. There are no designated OHV trails.

OHV’s must be properly licensed, equipped, and insured according to Idaho State Law, and operators must obey all traffic laws and ordinances.

OHV’s are like any other motorized vehicle when entering Castle Rocks State Park; an annual passport or Motor Vehicle Entry Fee is required. There are no entry fees associated with City of Rocks National Reserve.

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### **Where can I park and unload my OHV?**

State Park facilities are provided for this activity, but users are subject to motor vehicle entrance fees. Smoky Mountain Equestrian Day-use parking, the lower parking area at Castle Rocks Ranch Unit, and from any campsite for which the operator has reserved. The fee for entering these areas is \$5 per vehicle (e.g. If persons in a truck pulling a trailer with two OHV’s decide to park in one of the three areas listed above, and then off-load, and operate the OHV’s, then all three vehicles are subject to the MVEF, or valid Idaho Passport).

#### **Where can I park and unload my OHV without having to pay a fee?**

BLM and National Forest Lands surround the parks. Neither agency charges a fee to park, but OHV operators must not drive over vegetation or travel outside of designated trails and roads. In City of Rocks, use Bread Loaves or Bath Rock parking areas, or if camping there, you may also unload from your rented campsite for no additional charge.

#### **Can I park and unload my OHV at the visitor center?**

No. OHV’s are not allowed on state highways. The road immediately accessed from the visitor center (formerly known as the Elba-Almo Rd) is now Idaho State Highway 77 Spur.
