### Public Review Notice Email Correction for Modification of Entrance Fee at Historic Jamestowne and Yorktown Battlefield

YORKTOWN, Va. – Preservation Virginia and Colonial National Historical Park are proposing a modification in the entrance fee structure at Historic Jamestowne and Yorktown Battlefield. As required by Federal law, we are soliciting comment from the public and our community partners, including local government and the tourism industry, on the proposed changes before implementing any new fees.

As we consider the proposed fee changes, we will hold three informational meetings in the coming weeks to discuss the changes in more detail and address any questions or concerns. The first is scheduled for **Thursday, February 14, 2013 from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m.** at the Yorktown Battlefield Visitor Center (1000 Colonial Parkway, Yorktown); the second will be held on **Friday, February 15, 2013 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon** in the Williamsburg Regional Library Theatre (515 Scotland Street, Williamsburg); the third will be held on **Saturday, February 16, 2013 from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m.** at the Historic Jamestowne Visitor Center (1368 Colonial Parkway, Jamestown).
