
## Trails at PEEC and Cliff Park



Trails are a wonderful way to see the beauty of the park. With over ten miles of trail around the Pocono Environmental Education Center (PEEC) and about nine miles of trail in the Cliff Park area, visitors can enjoy a short stroll to an all-day adventure at either location.

### Hike Safely

- Ticks can carry Lyme and other diseases. Use repellents and frequently check for ticks.
- Don't feed or approach bears or other wildlife. Keep food in the trunk of your car and pets on a 6-foot leash. All wildlife are protected by law.
- Bring plenty of water.
- Wear sturdy shoes.
- Stay on the trail.
- Leave what you find. Don't pick, collect, or deface natural or cultural resources.
- Be prepared. Trails have limited cell phone coverage.
- Wear bright orange (shirt, vest, or hat) during hunting season.




Trail guides are available for a nominal fee at the main building.

Trail	Length	Difficulty	Blaze	Elevation Change	Highlights
Fossil	1.6 miles loop	Easy-moderate	Blue	237 feet	Fossils of ancient marine life; collection of fossils and other objects prohibited.
Ridgeline	4.5 miles loop	Moderate	Yellow	220 feet	Hilly terrain, featuring wetlands and forest.
Scenic Gorge	2.0 miles loop	Easy-moderate	Red	94 feet	Follows a stream through the forest; can be muddy after rains.
Tumbling Waters	3.0 miles loop	Moderate-difficult	Orange	254 feet	Scenic vista, waterfall, and meadow.
Two Ponds	1.5 miles loop	Easy	White	87 feet	Loops through pine stands and around two ponds.

### Directions

From US 209, turn west on Brisco Mountain Road (7 miles north of Bushkill or 5 miles south of PA 739). PEEC is approximately 1 mile on the right.



Trail	Length	Difficulty	Blaze	Elevation Change	Highlights
Buchanan	1.1 miles one-way	Easy-moderate	Orange	124 feet	Follows an old road trace through the forest.
Cliff	2.8 miles one-way	Moderate	White	390 feet	Forested path along the ridge top with several overlooks into the Delaware Valley below.
Hackers	1.4 miles one-way	Moderate	Yellow	340 feet	Shaded trail with a small waterfall in a hemlock ravine.
Milford Knob	1.3 miles one-way	Moderate-difficult	Green	390 feet	Steep climb to a vista overlooking the town of Milford.
Pond Loop	0.7 mile loop	Easy	Blue	51 feet	Loops around pond; opportunities to view wildlife.
Quarry Path	0.5 mile one-way	Moderate-difficult	Green-white	230 feet	Connector trail that features a vernal pool (seasonal wetland).
Raymondskill Creek	0.3 mile one-way	Easy-moderate	none	178 feet	Uneven path through hemlock forest to a three-tiered waterfall; spur trail to creek.

## Directions

**Hackers Trailhead:** From US 209, turn west on Raymondskill Road (2.5 miles south of US 206). Parking is ½ mile on the left.

**Milford Knob Trailhead:** Parking is on US 209, ¼ south of US 206.

**Cliff Park Trailhead:** From Route 2001/Milford Road, turn east on Cliff Park Road (2 miles south of Milford, second Cliff Park entrance). Turn right on first gravel road. Parking is ¼ mile.
