**A Women's History Month Program
Wednesday, March 30, 2011 • 10:30 a.m.**

The National Park Service (NPS) will celebrate the culmination of its special month-long program focusing on the women of America, one era at a time, on March 30 from 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Federal Hall National Memorial. "Women at War" will examine the roles of women during wartime both at home and on the battlefield beginning with World War II and moving forward through time to the present day.

An NPS Ranger will provide costumed interpretation of an American Red Cross Clubmobile worker during



World War II. The National Archives will be on hand as well to share documents and photos from the era. Information about Rosie The Riveter WWII Home Front National Historic Park in California will be available, including information on how to share WWII home front memories for inclusion at that park. Information about the war

memorials and monuments on the National Mall will also be available to view.

Additionally, female representatives and veterans of the

will speak about their experiences from WWII to the present, including Oliva Hooker, PhD, the first African-American Woman in the Coast Guard (SPAR, 1945).

Representatives from the United War Veterans Council will offer information about how their organization supports and honors America's veterans.
