### Public History Lab: Historic Site Interpretation



#### GRADUATE STUDENTS

*Spend your Saturday afternoons in a national park!*

This graduate-only course will immerse students in the work of public history in a national park. Students will work with National Park Service rangers and other public history professionals at Fort Vancouver National Historic Site. **GREG SHINE**, the park's Chief Ranger and Historian, will lead students through group discussion, directed readings, practical exercises, peer review, on-site class instruction, and research in the park's acclaimed Archives and Reference Collection. The class will culminate in a public program, where students will present 15-minute interpretive talks and other programs to the public, in accordance with NPS professional interpretive standards.
