Commander's Quarters - 12

Mess Halls - 55 and 57
Civilian Family Quarters – 80 (short term use to support chapel weddings)
Post Exchange - 70

General Agreement

Two Phases

Develop Prototypes for two Officers Row Buildings
Feasibility analysis and, if viable, comprehensive concept plan

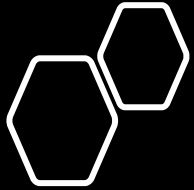

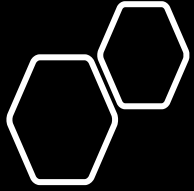
