### Road Work and Closures on Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive

Road work will continue on Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive with up to 30 minute delays and some temporary road and campground closures. Please review the dates and locations below.

**August 25<sup>th</sup>** Road crews will be working on the entrance road from the park boundary (cattle guard) up into the picnic area near Lehman Caves Visitor Center. Expect up to 30 minute delays.

**August 26<sup>th</sup>** Road crews will be working on restricted access roads in the morning. There should be no delays for the visiting public. Work may begin in the afternoon on the Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive. Expect delays up to 30 minutes.

**August 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>** Road crews will be working on the Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive from entrance road to Upper Lehman campground. Expect delays up to 30 minutes.

**Labor Day Holiday Weekend** – No road work, no delays.

**September 2<sup>nd</sup>** Road crews will begin working in Wheeler Peak Campground. The campground will close at noon. The Scenic Drive from the Summit Trailhead Parking to the campground will be closed.

**September 3<sup>rd</sup>** Road crews will continue work on the upper end of Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive. The Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive from the Summit Trailhead Parking to the campground will be closed.

**September 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>** Road Crews will be working on the Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive from Upper Lehman Campground to Wheeler Peak Campground. The Scenic Drive will be closed from Upper Lehman Campground to the Wheeler Peak Campground.
