



## Notice to All Employees and Residents of Lower Town Harpers Ferry

The 150th anniversary of John Brown's Raid will be commemorated over the weekend of **October 16-18, 2009**. In anticipation of large crowds the Police Department, in cooperation with Harpers Ferry National Historical Park and the Town Council, has developed a plan to provide parking and street closures to keep pedestrians safe and assure a quality experience for all.

### Friday, October 16:

Lower Town roads will be open. **Potomac Street Extended** from Dam 3 to Lower Town will be **closed starting at 9:00 a.m. Friday morning through Monday morning, Oct. 19.**

### Saturday, October 17:

Lower Town roads will be closed.

Washington St. will be barricaded at Union Street and Hillside Day Care from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Shenandoah St. will be barricaded at Highway 340 and Lower Town NPS Shuttle Bus stop from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.

### Sunday, October 18:

Lower Town roads will be closed.

Washington St. will be barricaded at Union Street and Hillside Day Care from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Shenandoah St. will be barricaded at Highway 340 and Lower Town NPS Shuttle Bus stop from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

All merchant and NPS employees of Lower Town Harpers Ferry will be provided free shuttle service from the Camp Hill area for Saturday, October 17 and Sunday, October 18.

Parking will be available in lots on Filmore Street between Zachary Taylor and Storer College Place. Specifically, the lots for the Shipley School and the lot for the Mather Training Center will be used.

A continuous shuttle will run **from the entrance of the Mather Training Center lot to High Street & Hog Alley** during peak times on each day.

Saturday 7 a.m. – 11 a.m. & 6 p.m. – 11 p.m.

Sunday 7 a.m. – 11 a.m. & 6 p.m. – 10 p.m.

Employees who need to enter and depart from Lower Town at other than peak times should plan to use the National Park Service Parking lot at Cavalier Heights.
