In 2003, the National Park Service acquired the 116,000-acre Kahuku Ranch, in the Ka'ū district of Hawai'i, adding a rich collection of ecosystems, lava flows, and high-elevation forests to Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park. These lands were extensively modified by cattle ranching, logging, and introduced plant and animal species, presenting a great challenge to natural resource managers tasked with protecting and restoring the native plant and animal communities there. On Tuesday, join Wildlife Biologist Jonathan Faford and Botanist Sierra McDaniel to learn about the successes and challenges of natural resources management at Kahuku. On Saturday, experience forest recovery first-hand on a guided hike and discover what makes Kahuku so unique and worthy of protection.
