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HISTORY

Richard and June Ross of Redlands, California compiled materials in the Richard and June Ross Genealogical Collection, between 1977 and 2004.

Richard Albert Ross was born on August 30, 1920, in Racine, Wisconsin. He graduated from Hyde Park High School in Chicago, Illinois, in 1938. Richard, who was known as "Dick" to his friends, served as a Warrant Officer in the US Army during World War II.

June Jennings Ross grew up in Houghton, Michigan, and graduated from Houghton High School in 1938. Richard and June met in California, where Richard started working for the California State Department of Employment in 1941. They were married in 1947. Richard retired in 1975. In 1977, Richard and June began the genealogical research that became their life's work and their lasting legacy.

The Richard and June Ross Genealogical Collection focuses primarily on Cornish genealogical information due to June Ross' Cornish family background. Despite Richard Ross' family background, which is primarily Italian, both husband and wife were equally zealous in the pursuit of their research, and quite prolific.

Richard died on February 16, 2005, at the age of 84.

DESCRIPTION The Richard and June Ross Genealogical Collection is largely comprised of Cornish genealogical information compiled by the Rosses from various sources in the United States and Cornwall. Some additional genealogical material about other ethnic groups, genealogical information about specific families, general historical articles, and articles about genealogy and genealogical research are also included in the collection.

Richard and June Ross of Redlands, California compiled materials in the Richard and June Ross Genealogical Collection, during their retirement years, between 1977 and 2004.

The couple traveled around the United States, Cornwall, and other countries gathering information, and returned to California between trips to compile and index all the information they had gathered. Their primary focus was on Cornish miners who immigrated to the United States to work in various parts of the country, including the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, Wisconsin, Montana, Colorado, and California. The Rosses donated collections of genealogical material to a number of repositories in the United States and Cornwall, though the Ross Collection at Keweenaw National Historical Park is thought to comprise the bulk of the material they produced. Though the collection is comprehensive, and some material is known to be duplicative of materials held by other repositories, it may not represent all of the work produced by the Rosses.

Source materials utilized by the Rosses include vital records such as birth, baptism, death, marriage, and naturalization

records. Other sources include newspapers, census records, immigration records, ship manifests, military records, county and municipal directories, and other published and unpublished materials.

Richard and June Ross compiled genealogical information from the various parishes in the Cornwall region of England, from historic mining regions in the United States, and from other countries including Sweden, the West Indies, Canada, Finland, and Mexico. States in the United States represented in the Ross Collection include Arizona, California, Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Montana, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Utah, Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.

Many people represented in the collection settled permanently or temporarily in the Copper Country region of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

ORGANIZATION

The Richard and June Ross Genealogical Collection is organized into four series based on format. Series I is comprised of assembled albums; Series II is comprised of loose-leaf manuscript material; Series III is comprised of microform material; and Series IV is comprised of bound, published works.

PROVENANCE

Richard and June Ross produced materials in the Richard and June Ross Genealogical Collection in the course of their genealogical research between 1977 and 2004. Richard and June Ross to Keweenaw National Historical Park donated the collection in two accessions; the first in 2001, and the second in 2004. The Keweenaw National Historical Park Archives reading room is named the Richard and June Ross Reading Room in honor of the Rosses, their genealogical work, and their generous donation to the park.
