



Water Safety Programs

As warmer weather approaches, students will be planning trips to the lake or the swimming pool. Get a jump on safety and invite a park ranger to your school to present a water safety program for your grade level.

Students will learn about the importance of wearing a life jacket or how to rescue someone from the water without becoming a victim. Taking a few minutes to learn about water safety can save a child from drowning.

All water safety programs will include hands-on activities and role playing to demonstrate the importance of life jackets while being in, on or near the water. Presentations are one hour in length.



Life Jackets Float - You Don't!

Grade 1

This program teaches students how to put on a life jacket and determine whether or not the jackets fits properly. It won't work if you don't wear it!

Saved by the Jacket!

Grade 3

A life jacket can save your life, but only if you use it. Students learn the importance of wearing a life jacket while on, in or near the water.

Talk, Reach, Throw and Don't Go!

Grade 5

Students learn the four basic steps on how to rescue a person from the water without becoming victims themselves.
