Who can participate? Any youth of legal hunting age, to 18, who has successfully completed a hunter safety class and has the appropriate licenses. Parents or adult guardians are encouraged to attend, but cannot hunt. Youth will be paired with an experienced hunter as he guides you to harvest these elusive gamebirds.

When? All day Saturday, schedule and departure will be determined. Sunday hunt is on your own.

What?

- Enjoy talks and lessons on the Mojave Desert
- Gun and backcountry safety
- Natural history of Gambel's Quail and Chukars
- Field care and dressing harvested game
- Tour Safari Club International (SCI) mobile sensory unit
- Saturday breakfast of hotcakes, sausage and bacon
- Saturday evening feast of hamburgers, hotdogs and, hopefully, quail and chukar

Where? Hole-in-the-Wall Group & Equestrian site. Bring your tent, camp trailer, or motorhome and enjoy two nights and two days in the Preserve. There are no trailer hookups, but water and pit toilets are available.

Each person is responsible for his/her own lunch.

Shotguns and ammunition can be made available for your use, by request.



Space is limited to the first 25 youths to register. Late registrants will be placed on a waiting list.
