Last month, the U.S. Global Change Research Program released the second volume of the Fourth National Climate Assessment (NCA4). The second volume details impacts and risks associated with climate change, as well as response strategies.

The report includes topical chapters examining implications for everything from air quality to water. Additionally, report chapters provide summary findings for 10 discrete regions across the United States.


