Resist, Accept, or Direct?



A new report titled <u>Resist-Accept-Direct (RAD)—A Framework for the 21st-</u> <u>century Natural Resource Manager</u> [PDF] was recently published in the National Park Service Natural Resource Report series. The report introduces a decision framework that provides a simple tool that encompasses the entire decision space for managing ecosystems facing the potential for rapid, irreversible ecological change. It assists managers in making informed, purposeful choices about how to respond to the trajectory of change, and moreover, provides a straightforward approach to support resource managers in collaborating at larger scales across jurisdictions.
