ALASKA

Reserving Lands for Use of National Park Service as Headquarters Site for Administration of the Sitka and Glader Bay National Monuments; Partially Revoking Public Land Order No. 842 of June 19, 1952

By virtue of the authority vested in the President, and pursuant to Executive Order No. 10355 of May 26, 1962, it is ordered as follows:

1. Subject to valid existing rights, the following-described public lands in Alaska are hereby withdrawn from all forms of appropriation under the public land laws, including the mining and mineral leasing laws and disposals of materials under the act of July 31, 1947 (61 Stat. 681; 30 U.S.C. 801-604), as amended, and reserved for use of the National Park Service, Department of the Interior, as a headquarters site for the combined administration of the Sitks and Olacier Bay National Monuments:

- 2. Public Land Order No. 843 of June 19, 1962, which withdraw lands for classification is hereby revoked so far as it affects the lands described in paragraph 1 hereof.
- 2. This order shall not be construed to affect or to impair any rights or privfleges the natives of the area may have to the use and enjoyment of their es-

tablished campaite on the south shore of Herring Cove in their customary manner.
