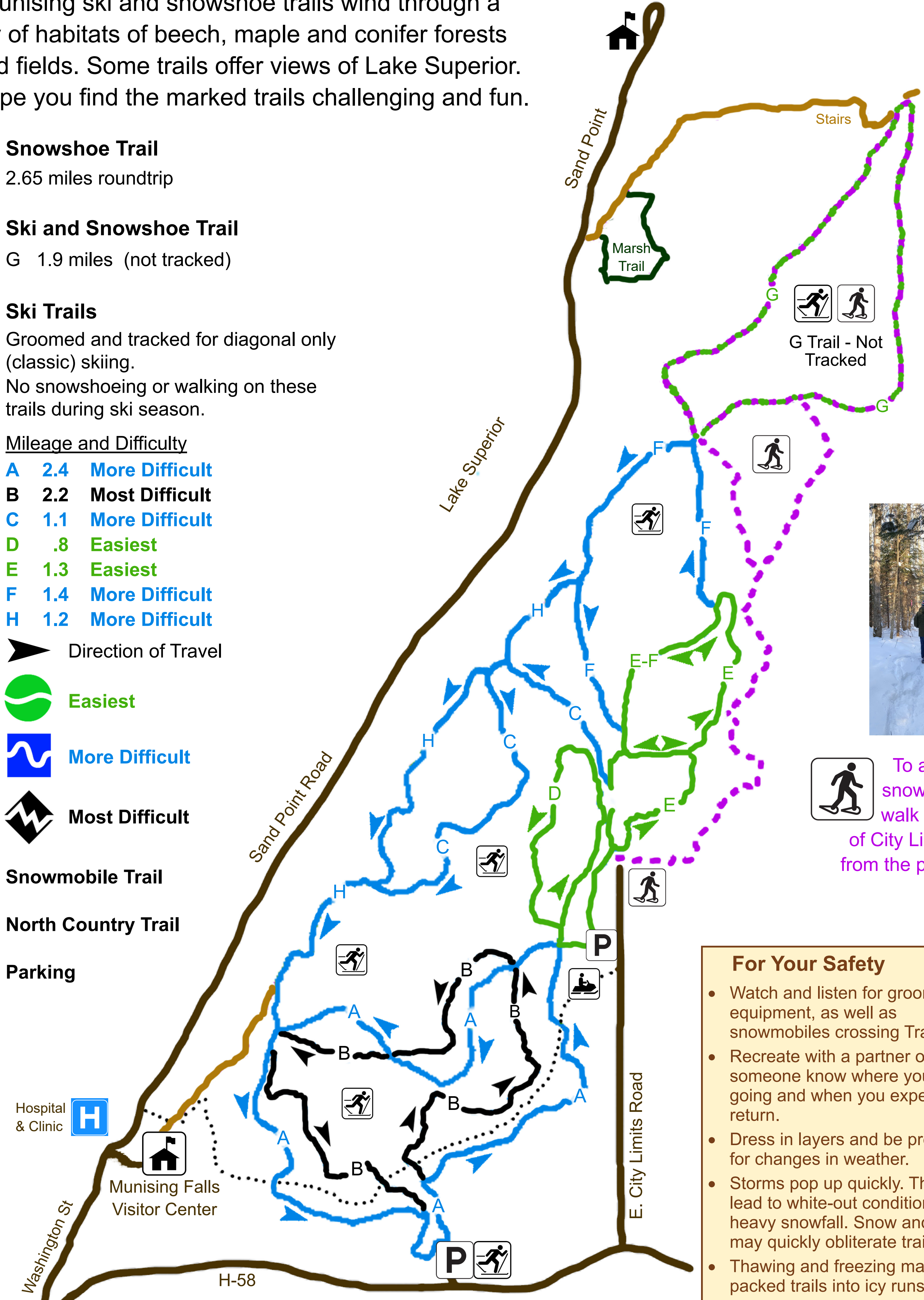

To access the snowshoe trail, walk to the end of City Limits Road from the parking lot.

**For Your Safety**

- Watch and listen for grooming equipment, as well as snowmobiles crossing Trails A & B.
- Recreate with a partner or let someone know where you are going and when you expect to return.
- Dress in layers and be prepared for changes in weather.
- Storms pop up quickly. They can lead to white-out conditions and heavy snowfall. Snow and wind may quickly obliterate trails.
- Thawing and freezing may turn packed trails into icy runs.
- For emergencies, dial 911.
