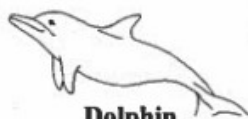


Scavenger Hunt

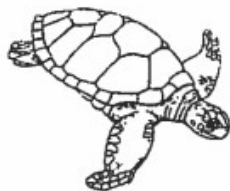

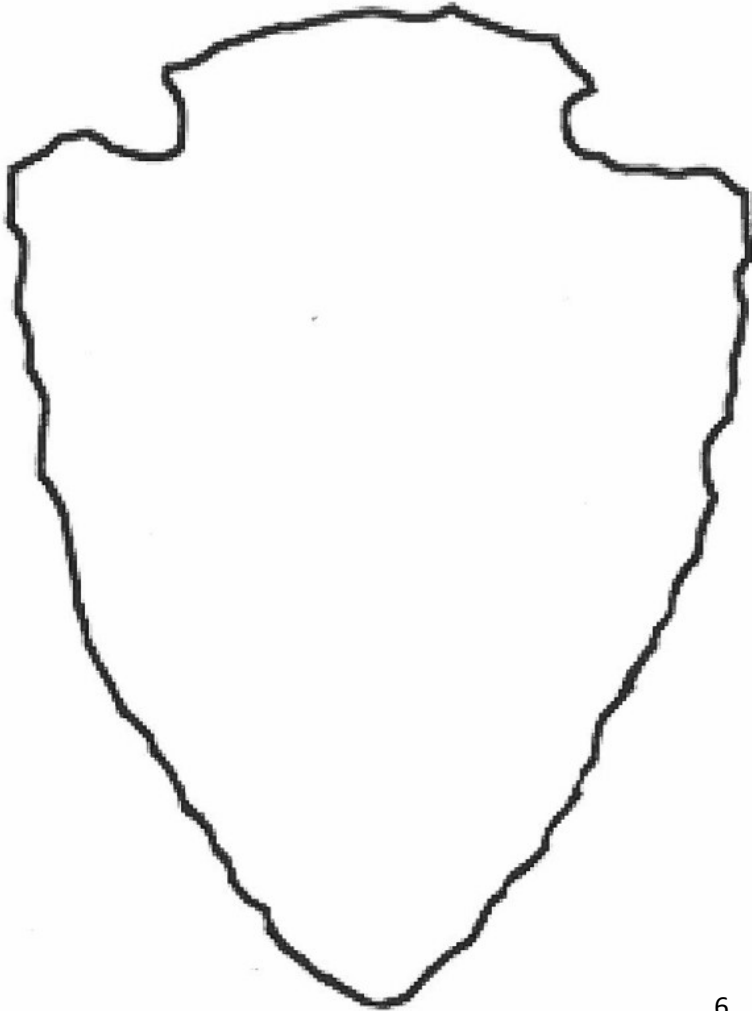
