



Pu‘uhonua o Hōnaunau National Historical Park

Picnic Area Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Natural and archaeological features, artifacts, and other historic objects may not be touched or moved.** No digging, scraping or excavating allowed.
- 2. Construction of shelters, such as tents or umbrellas, or other facilities and modifications to the area are prohibited.**
- 3. Pets (dogs, cats, others) must be restrained via attended leash,** with a maximum length of 6 feet, and under control at all times. Pet excrement must be placed in garbage containers. **DO NOT TIE THEM TO THE TREES.**
- 4. Loud music or other audio disturbances are prohibited.** The operation of vehicle audio systems, portable audio devices or musical instruments must be below a volume level that can be heard from an adjacent or other picnic site.
- 5. No open fires.** All cooking will be limited to camp stove or contained charcoal fire grill. Tiki type torches, etc., are not permitted in the park.
- 6. Non-native plants are not permitted in the park.** That includes orchids, plumeria, etc.
- 7. Area must be cleaned prior to departure.** Appropriate waste and recycling containers are provided.
- 8. Participating in sports and activities such as the following are prohibited:** Frisbee, volleyball, horseshoes, kite flying, baseball, football, soccer, stringing up signs, streamers and balloons; and setting up hammocks or tents.
- 9. Special Use Permits required for the following:** Weddings, birthday parties, memorials, special events, or picnic groups over 20 persons, maximum number 50. Maximum number of park-owned picnic tables at any picnic site is two. *Contact Chief Ranger for information (328-2326 x 1220)*
- 10. Park and picnic area hours are from 7:00 AM to 7:45 PM daily (hours change according to sunset). Overnight camping is prohibited.**
