





# What You Need to Know

<b>Check in</b> After 1 pm	<b>Quiet Hours</b> 10 pm- 6 am
<b>Check out</b> 12 noon	<b>Speed Limit</b> 10 mph


 **Cell service is unreliable.** Do not depend on your phone for navigation or emergency help.

 **Pets are only allowed in picnic areas, parking lots, campgrounds, and along roadsides.** They must be on leashes no longer than 6 feet at all times. Pets (including emotional support and therapy animals) are not allowed anywhere else in the park, including trails and buildings.








 **Keep snacks to yourself.** It is illegal to feed wildlife. Human food damages wild animals' ability to process food and can kill them. Keep food within reach at all times.

 **Fires are only allowed in the metal fire grates provided.** Do not move fire grates or create fire rings. Never leave fires or coals unattended. Fires must be completely out before leaving the campsite or going to bed.

 There are **no laundry facilities** in the park.

 Some wildlife depend on the darkness of night. Keep lights pointed down, avoid bright settings, and use red-light flashlights when possible.


### Prohibited in the park:


-  Use of skateboards, rollerblades, scooters, or similar devices.
-  Operating drones
-  Fireworks
-  Trenching or putting nails in trees
-  Marijuana possession and use
-  Hanging tents
-  Hummingbird or bird feeders

# Campground Features


 **Firewood sales**

 **Potable water spigots.** Spigots are not threaded and there are no hookups of any kind.

 **Restrooms** with outside sinks for washing dishes and disposing of waste/gray water.

 **Sanitary dump station**

 **Seasonal shuttle stop.** Avoid traffic and take the shuttle to popular areas in the Bear Lake Road Corridor.

 **Solar shower stall.** Must bring your own solar heated shower bag.

*Use of portable showers or shower tents is not allowed in the park.*

 **Trash and recycling stations**

### Additional Information:

- **Maximum 8** people per site in Loop A, B, C, and D.
- Tent only camping in Group Sites.
- **Generators** are permitted in all Loop A, B, and D sites, and in Loop C sites 63-75 and 105-120. Generators may be run between 7:30-10 am and 4-8:30 pm. **Generator use in Group Sites and Loop C sites 76-104 is prohibited.**
- Vehicles (includes trailers/RVs) must be completely parked on designated gravel or pavement.
- **Overflow parking** may be available. Talk to a ranger or campground host.
- During Timed Entry, Glacier Basin campers have access to all areas of the park, including the Bear Lake Road Corridor.

# Food Storage Requirements

Wildlife depend on you to stay alive and healthy! You can protect wildlife by properly storing all scented items and food.

**If your campsite has a food storage locker,** you are required to use it unless staying in a hard-sided RV.

**If your campsite does NOT have a food storage locker,** you are required to store all scented items and food inside your vehicle. They must be out of sight, with windows completely closed and doors locked. Never store items in a truck bed or strapped to the outside of a vehicle.

- **Scented items and food** that must be stored include, but are not limited to:
  - Food, chewing gum, drinks, and drink containers or water bottles
  - Cleaning supplies
  - Toiletries (soap, shampoo, sunscreen, deodorant, lip balm)
  - Cosmetics
  - Pet food and bowls
  - Garbage (food scraps, empty cans or bottles, food wrappers)
- **All coolers (including "bear-proof"), stoves, grills, non-disposable tableware, and cookware** must be stored in food storage lockers or vehicles.
- Wildlife can visit at any time. Never leave scented items unattended. Keep these items stored at all times when not in use. **Improperly storing or leaving out food, garbage, or scented items will result in confiscation and/or citation.**

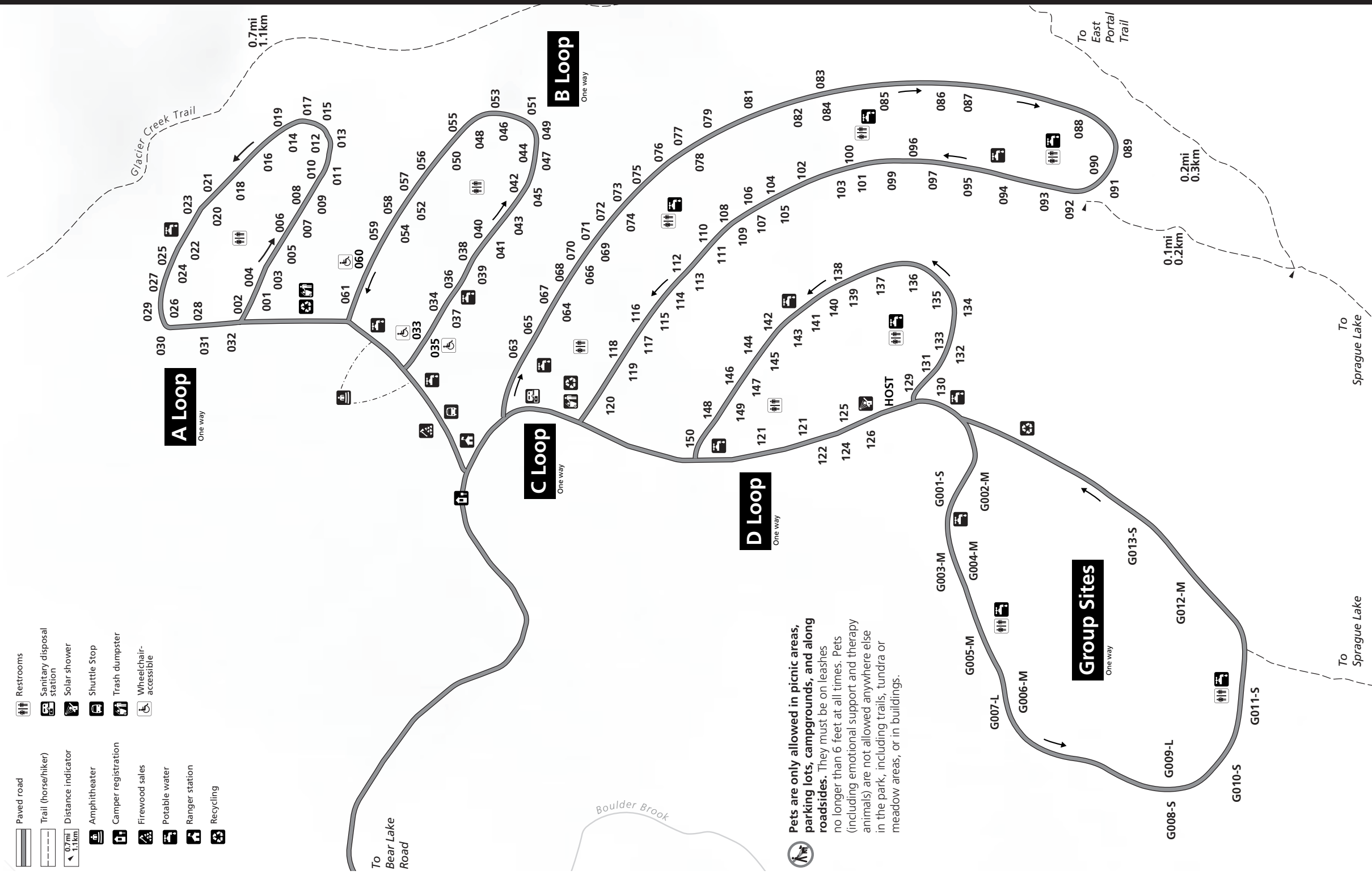
