




Connections: The Far West and Civil War 2013 Summer Lecture Series

Connections: Pig War to Civil War. Mike Vouri is the historian for San Juan Island National Historical Park and the author of five books about San Juan Island history. His lecture introduces the series.



JULY 20 Lorraine McConaghy

Territorial Voices: A Civil War Reader's Theater. Lorraine McConaghy is the historian for the Seattle Museum of Science and Industry. Attendees read aloud authentic letters from soldiers and families.



AUGUST 2 Boyd Pratt

The Disputed Islands During the American Civil War. Historian Boyd Pratt describes how settlement proceeded during the joint military occupation at the height of the American Civil War when regular U.S. Army troops shared the island with Royal Marines.




AUGUST 3 Karen Haas

I Am Always on the Women's Side. Historian and storyteller Karen Haas portrays women from differing walks of life and points of view. Her vignettes address a neglected side of Civil War life: women striving to survive in a time of violence, turmoil and societal change.



AUGUST 10 Candace Wellman

American Officers, Indian Families and the Civil War. Historian Candace Wellman will discuss American Indian and First Nations families who trace their roots back to white U.S. Army officers (including George Pickett) and boundary survey officials.



AUGUST 17 Bruce Brown

Conversations with Crazy Horse. Bruce Brown, author of *Mountains in the Clouds*, talks about American Indian oral histories as they relate to the Battle of the Little Bighorn and Civil War veteran George A. Custer, a former colleague of San Juan officers.
