### Welcome to spring in Shenandoah!

There's no better time to be in Shenandoah! Stop by the visitor centers, catch a Ranger Program, and watch the parade of spring wildflowers as the forest wakes up.

### Opt in to alerts!

To receive alerts about Skyline Drive status and other critical information, text SHENALERTS to 888777. For campground availability status, text SHENCAMP to 888777.

### Bringing your pet with you?

Pets must be on a 6' physical leash at all times. Waste bags should never be left in the Park. If a trash receptacle is not immediately available, take the waste bag with you until you find one. Pets are prohibited on the following trails: Fox Hollow, Stony Man, Limberlost, Post Office Junction to Old Rag Shelter, Old Rag Ridge, Old Rag Saddle, Ridge Access, Dark Hollow Falls, Story of the Forest, Bearfence Mountain, and Frazier Discovery.

### Pack it in, pack it out.

Keeping food and trash from bears and other animals is essential to their well-being, as well as yours. We need your help! Shenandoah is too vast (200,000 acres and 500 miles of trails) to have conveniently placed animalproof trash receptacles everywhere. You may need to carry your trash and pet waste with you until you get to an area with receptacles — think lodges, picnic areas, visitor centers, etc. Or, better yet! Take it home.

# Old Rag

March 1 through November 30, you must have a dayuse ticket to access the Old Rag area in addition to your entrance permit or pass. Tickets are \$2 and should be purchased in advance at www.rec.gov. See our website for details. The day-use ticket requirement limits daily use of the Old Rag area to 800 people, improving the visitor experience and protecting fragile resources. ### **Tips for Your Visit**

- For future visits, get your entrance pass online: www.recreation.gov/sitepass/74293
- Hiking Old Rag Mountain from March 1 to November 30 requires a day-use ticket. Tickets are available online: *www.rec.gov*
- Download the NPS App, choose "Shenandoah" and get great onsite information and navigation. See our website for details.
- Try to avoid crowds! If a parking area is full, move on to another trail.
- Drive the posted speed limit and be sure to pull completely off the road when viewing wildlife.
- Be aware: cars and bikes share the road. Despite recent changes to Virginia laws, federal regulations require bicyclists to ride single file at all times in Shenandoah National Park.
- Don't rely on your cell phone; coverage in the Park is unreliable.
- Stay on the hiking trail and never climb around waterfalls.
- Never leave food or trash unattended, even for a few minutes. Secure all trash in bear-resistant trash cans or dumpsters.
- Fires are only allowed in park-built grates or fire rings. Fires must be fully extinguished.
- Drones are prohibited in all national parks.

# **Backcountry Permits**

Shenandoah's backcountry permitting system has moved online. Paper permits are no longer valid. Permits can be purchased at www.rec.gov. See our website for more details. The online system will allow us to better protect campers in the event of an emergency. There is a new fee associated with the permit which will be used for administrative costs and to support trail and facility maintenance, and backcountry staff.




