

They twist, turn, and confuse people who don't know the area. In the Stonewall Uprising, protesters used their local knowledge of this maze to avoid the Tactical Police Force and keep returning to protest outside the Stonewall Inn.



Key:

The Stonewall Inn. Begin and end here.

The street is blocked by a barricade! Turn around.

The Tactical Patrol Force is clearing the streets in the direction the arrow! Proceed only in the direction of the arrow.

Junior Rangers Act as Stewards for National Parks and Sites

Stewardship is the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to a person, group of people, or organization. The National Park Service aims to be a good steward of our natural and cultural resources—protecting nature, historic buildings and objects, and landscapes within a national park. However, we can all be good stewards and take care of special places. Some examples of things you can do to be a good steward are:

- Not littering or harming buildings, animals, or environment.
- Learning about wildlife and history of a protected area near you.
- Volunteering at a park or historic site.
- Telling others about the importance of protecting special places.

Do you do one of these or something else to be a steward? (Hint: you have been doing one of them to become a Junior Ranger!)


