NOTE.—This company served as Company "F", 22d Tennessee Infantry, but being composed of Kentuckians, was by S. O. 41, "Army of the Mississippi", May 15, 1862, transferred to the 3d Kentucky Infantry as Company "M".

Roll from September 30, 1862 to January 1, 1863—The company left camp near the mouth of Tippo Creek, Dec. 1, 1862, and after a five days march, reached this station, Grenada, Mississippi, a distance of sixty miles.

Roll from June 30, 1863 to August 31, 1863—Marched from Camp near Canton, Mississippi to Big Creek, a distance of twenty miles, from Big Creek to Jackson, where was engaged and present during the siege of Jackson; marched on retreat from Jackson to Newton Station, Mississippi, distance about sixty miles; from Newton by rail to Morton, Mississippi.

THE THIRD REGIMENT INFANTRY, KENTUCKY

(SERVED AS MOUNTED INFANTRY)

The Third Kentucky was organized at Camp Boone, Montgomery County, Tennessee, about the 20th of July, 1861, with the following officers: Lloyd Tilghman, Colonel; Albert P. Thompson, Lieutenant Colonel; Ben Anderson, Major; Captain Alfred Boyd, Assistant Quartermaster; Captain J. S. Byers, Assistant Commissary; Doctor J. W. Thompson, Surgeon; Doctor J. B. Sanders, Assistant Surgeon. Colonel Tilghman was promoted to Brigadier General shortly after the organization and Thompson became Colonel and Anderson Lieutenant-Colonel; Captain Johnson became Major. They had been partially supplied with Belgian rifles, but owing to the scarcity of any kind of arms, numbers of them had to use the old flint-lock musket; they retained these arms up to and including the battle of Shiloh. The cartridge consisted of powder, one large ball about an ounce in weight, and three buck-shot; this proved to be a very efficient ammunition, as was demonstrated at Shiloh.

The Third was organized into a brigade with the Second, Fourth and Ninth Kentucky, and at first was under the immediate command of General S. B. Buckner.

This regiment was organized as an infantry regiment July 5th, 1861, at Camp Boone, Tenn., in which branch of the service it remained until about the 10th of March, 1864, when it was mounted by order of the Secretary of War.

REMARKS.

162. Teamster; relieved from extra duty Oct. 15, 1863.

Roll from August 31, 1863 to October 31, 1863—Company marched from Morton, Miss., to Canton, Miss., distance of thirty miles.

Roll from May 1, 1863, to July 1, 1864—This company left Dresden, Tennessee, May 1, 1864 and arrived at Tupelo, Miss., May 6; on the 16th marched to Corinth; on 23d returned to Tupelo; on 26th detached as escort for General Buford; on 30th marched to Aberdeen; June 2d, 3d, etc. left Aberdeen for North Alabama; on 14th returned from Alabama to Tupelo; June 7th left Tupelo for Booneville; June 10th left Booneville and attacked the enemy at Tishomingo Creek; on 13th returned to Guntown with prisoners; on the 19th went to Baldwyn; on the 20th returned to Tupelo.

VOLUNTEERS, CONFEDERATE STATES ARMY.

AFTER MARCH 10, 1864.)

After the regiment left Bowling Green, it was with that part of the brigade which was not at Fort Donelson, but fought with General Breckinridge at Shiloh where it suffered severely, losing one hundred and seventy-four of its number, including all the regimental officers who were engaged in the battle. The Third was with the army at Corinth, then moved to Coffeeville; was at Vicksburg during the naval bombardment, participating in the battle of Baton Rouge, returning to Vicksburg, fought at Chickasaw Bayou; served in Buford's Brigade, Loring's division during Grant's campaign in May, 1863, taking part in the battles of Champion's Hill, Baker's Creek, and being there cut off from Pemberton's command, participated in General J. E. Johnston's operations, for the relief of Vicksburg. The brigade was soon mounted and assigned to duty under Forrest, with whom the Third Regiment was actively engaged during the remainder of the war, participating in the attack on Paducah, the capture of Fort Pillow, the victory at Brice's Cross Roads and the great capture of Federal stores at Johnsonville, as well as many other famous deeds and the battles of Hood's Nashville campaign.

In the earlier dates of promotions, elections, discharges, etc., of officers, there may be many inaccuracies, as all the records of the regiment and companies were lost at Baker's Creek, Miss., May 16, 1863.

REMARKS

1. Was from Columbia, Kentucky, and at time of commission into the Confederate service was 37 years of age; was 2d Lieutenant, then 1st Lieutenant of Co. "B," 4th Kentucky Vol. Infantry in the Mexican War; was commissioned Colonel P. A. C. S., Sept. 13, 1861; commanded First Ky. Brigade at the battle of Shiloh and Stone River after Hanson fell; died of disease in Richmond, Va., Feb. 12, 1863.
2. Was from Glasgow, Kentucky, and at time of enlistment into the Confederate Army was 33 years of age; was promoted from Captain of Co. "A," to Major, Apr. 7, 1862, to Lieut. Colonel, Dec. 18, 1862, to Colonel, Feb. 28, 1863; was acting Major at battle of Shiloh, where he was severely wounded; was again wounded at Stone River on Jan. 2, 1863; wounded and permanently disabled at Chickamauga, Sept. 20, 1863; was retired from service; died in Glasgow, Ky., Mar. 30, 1896.
3. Was from Louisville, Ky., and at time of enlistment into the Confederate Army, was 21 years of age; was Captain of Co. "I," and promoted to Major, Mar. 27, 1863, to Lieut. Colonel Aug. 31, 1863, to Colonel, February, 1864; was three times wounded at the battle of Shiloh, Apr. 6, 1862, and again wounded at Chickamauga, Sept. 20, 1863; died in Louisville, Ky., Aug. 6, 1882.
4. Was from Nelson County, Ky., and Lieutenant Colonel at organization of Regiment at Camp Boone; was wounded at Shiloh, Apr. 7, 1862; resigned Dec. 18, 1862.
5. Promoted from Major.
6. Promoted from Major; severely wounded at Shiloh, Apr. 6, 1862; resigned Aug. 31, 1863, and died in Hart County, Ky.
7. Promoted from Major.

8. Was from Frankfort, Ky., and at time of entering the Confederate Army was 28 years of age; was mortally wounded at Shiloh, Apr. 7, 1862, about 1 o'clock p. m., and died on the field.
9. Promoted from Captain of Co. "A."
10. Promoted from Captain of Co. "D;" wounded at Baton Rouge, La., Aug. 5, 1862; killed at Stone River, Jan. 2, 1863; was from Scott County, Ky.
11. Promoted from Captain of Co. "F."
12. Promoted from Captain of Co. "I."
13. Was from Owensboro, Ky., and promoted to Major from Captain of Co. "K;" was with his command at Shiloh, first siege of Vicksburg, at Baton Rouge, at Stone River, Jackson, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, Rocky Face Gap, Resaca and Dallas; was wounded at Stone River and Chickamauga, and killed at Dallas, May 28, 1864.
14. Was from Barren County, Ky., and at time of joining the Confederate Army was 26 years of age; was promoted to Major from Captain of Co. "A;" was with his command at Shiloh, where he was wounded, Apr. 7, 1862; was at first siege of Vicksburg, at Baton Rouge, Stone River, Jackson, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, Rocky Face Gap, Resaca and Dallas; was supposed to have been killed on the skirmish line at Kennesaw Mountain, June 20, 1864; never heard from after.
15. Was from Montgomery County, Ky., and elected 1st Lieutenant of Co. "H;" assigned to duty as Regimental Adjutant and was promoted to Captain and A. A. General on Staff of Gen. Hawes, Apr. 11, 1862; after temporary assignment on Staff of Gen. J. C. Breckinridge, was transferred to Gen. Hawes' Staff in Trans-Mississippi Department.
16. Mortally wounded and died, July 26, 1864.
17. Was a member of Co. "E;" was promoted from the ranks to be 1st Lieutenant and Adjutant.
18. Assistant Quartermaster; promoted from Co. "D."
19. Became Quartermaster of Gen. Joe Lewis' Brigade, Dec. 13, 1863.

2. Promoted to Captain April 7, 1862; captured at Kennesaw Mountain, Ga., on June 20, 1864; was made Major, May 28, 1864; never again heard of after being taken prisoner.
3. Promoted May 28, 1864.
4. Wounded April 6th at Shiloh and promoted to Captain on April 7, 1862 and to Major on May 28, 1864; taken prisoner at Kennesaw Mountain and never again heard from.
5. Promoted to 1st Lieutenant, April 7, 1862 and to Captain May 28, 1864.

one Commissioned officer, Nathaniel D. Clayton, who afterwards died of his wounds; Corporal Geo. W. that place, and as there was no exchange until the following September, none of them were engaged at Shiloh, Vicksburg, and Baton Rouge, except those few. Some of them escaped from prison, and attached themselves to cavalry commands, with which they afterwards served. After the exchange, the company remained in charge of Capt. Graves, until the arrival at Murfreesboro, when it was returned to the regiment, and served with it during the remainder of the war. At Jackson, these men aided in serving the guns of a battery; and at Chickamauga, during the second day's engagement, they turned a captured battery of the enemy upon them, which contributed materially to Confederate success on that part of the line.

REMARKS.

1. Was elected Captain Sept. 9, 1861; was at Fort Donelson in the engagements of February 12th to 16th, taken prisoner and exchanged; resigned Nov. 1, 1862.
2. Was first elected as 2d Lieutenant of Co. "K", Sept. 13, 1861, and assigned to temporary command of Co. "B", Dec., 1862; was elected Captain of Co. "B", January 10, 1863; wounded at Resaca, Ga., May 14, 1864 and again at Dallas, on May 29, 1864; after recovery was assigned to duty as Provost Marshal, under Provost Marshal General Martin H. Cofer.
3. Was elected 1st Lieutenant, Sept. 9, 1861; was at Fort Donelson in the engagements of February 12th to 16th, taken prisoner and sent to Camp Chase; escaped from Camp Chase and reached Burnsville, Miss., where he reported to General John C. Breckinridge, and assigned to staff duty as Ordnance Officer, and Chief of Artillery, with rank of Captain; was assigned as Assistant Adjutant General of Division with rank of Major, and promoted for gallantry at the battle of Chickamauga to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel; was again taken prisoner at Missionary Ridge, Nov. 25, 1863, and held to close of the war.
