twenty yards of the enemy's entrenched lines that swarmed with riflemen many times its force. Col. Hawkins discovered the regiment on his left, some distance to the rear, retiring. The 5th Kentucky having no support on its right, now none on its left and having received no orders to retire, steadily advancing to destruction oblivious of its perilous position. The incessant roar of battle precluding any orders to retire, at this critical moment, to save his regiment from annihilation, Col. Hawkins rushed to the colors, seized the bearer, faced him about and started the colors to the rear. All the men not killed or seriously wounded returned with the colors and formed in their works.

The brigade historian makes record of this "heroic and desperate charge, well illustrating the dashing, yet steady and unflinching courage of Kentuckians—the indomitable will that makes them maintain unequal conflict and brave destruction rather than falter or flee."

"Estimated loss in this short interval of time, fifty-one per cent."

In the battle of Intrenchment Creek, July 22, the disaster to the 5th Kentucky was little, if any, less than at Dallas. The Kentucky Brigade, on the right of Hardie's Corps, when nearing the position of the enemy, General Bate having some information to support his belief that the enemy was not aware of our approach, came riding down the line of the brigade, hat in hand, saying "At 'em! At 'em! At 'em! The enemy knows nothing of our approach." The artillery with the division had been hurried up, but before it could be brought into position, the brigade was rushed forward some distance in advance of the troops on our left (mill pond and other obstructions in this way), and having no support on our right (Wheeler, who was to form on our right, being a mile away)

pressing forward through the open woods, soon brought us to the edge of open ground in front of the 5th Kentucky. The enemy some eighty yards across this opening, instead of being surprised at our approach, were behind their works, waiting our advance. As soon as the 5th Kentucky was in plain view, the enemy from our right, our left and front, poured a terrific fire upon our lines. In the short time of a few seconds one-third of the 5th Kentucky was shot down, killed or severely wounded, including half the color company, the lieutenant commanding it mortally wounded. Colors of the regiment lost. Colonel Hawkins at the front with his men, with eight holes shot through his coat, one ball from the right through his sword belt, another through the breast of his coat, when one from the left tore through his left hip, knocking him to the ground, fortunately not striking a vital point. He immediately rose to his feet, when not a man on foot was to be seen, all who were able to do so had retired. Col. Hawkins, to prevent being captured, made his way out. This battle, much like that at Dallas, was most unfortunate. If the proper precaution had been taken the brigade could have been sheltered from any of the enemy's guns in less than 200 yards of his position, until the artillery, Wheeler and the troops on the left could have taken position, when by the simultaneous dash of this formidable force of infantry and cavalry following in the wake of shot and shell by the artillery, the strong probability is that we would have captured the enemy, or certainly have driven him back on Sherman's rear, instead of the fruitless sacrifice of so many lives that might have been avoided.

In the battle of Jonesboro, the 5th Kentucky with the other regiments suffered seriously, charging upon the enemy fortified in his works. Lieut. Colonel Connor, as has been shown, was seriously wounded. On the 7th of September, just

four months from the time the brigade marched out from Dalton, General Lewis having received orders, moved the brigade to Barnesville, to be mounted. From this time on until the close of the war, the brigade operated as mounted infantry in Wheeler's Corps. The 5th Kentucky with the brigade, now attached to Iverson's division, was constantly engaged in scout and picket duty until the 15th of November, when at Stockbridge, eighteen miles south of Atlanta, Col. Hawkins was ordered with a detachment from the brigade, including 100 men on foot (not yet having received their mounts) with part of his regiment to proceed upon Yellow Rivre, east of Atlanta, to operate against foraging parties the enemy was expecting to continue sending out in that section (and if possible capture mounts for the men on foot.) While out on this duty Sherman's army passed down the country between his detachment and Iverson's division. Being cut off from his command, he moved on the enemy's flank two days, picking up stragglers and preventing the spread of the scourge in that direction. Meeting with a company of Texas Rangers, the rangers and the detachment co-operated while they were together. The following day the rangers dashed forward some distance in advance, ran upon and captured 400 of the enemy, demanding them to lay down their arms instantly (or the regiment would immediately fire on them.) Col. Hawkins now crossed in the rear of the enemy to Macon (on the way captured thirty large Tennessee or Kentucky beeves and delivered them to the Commissary at Macon) where he found that the enemy was still between him and the brigade. Leaving all his men not mounted, with his force now of seventy, he attempted to reach his command by passing in front of Sherman, but this was not to be, until Sherman got to the sea. Being headed off, he moved on down to Liberty County, where he found much important work demanding all his force, energy

and ability, the county being over-run by marauding parties of the enemy. Negroes, all demoralized, quit work, congregated about on the plantations, appropriating whatever they desired for their own use. Col. Hawkins sent couriers to report to the brigade commander, and received orders, Dec. 27, from the division commander, Gen. Iverson, to remain and take charge of all the mounted troops in that section "and not obey the orders of his brigade commander to move until he heard from General Wheeler." Taking in the situation, Col. Hawkins made a sweep through the county, striking a large foraging party at Hinesville, the county town, capturing some of the enemy and a few horses, stampeding the enemy from the county. Not a white man was to be seen on his premises. On the first of January, Col. Hawkins was on his way with his command (under orders) to division headquarters. On his arrival, he was given his entire regiment, and sent back with "orders from General Iverson to establish himself in command on a line extending from the Agechee River ferry, to the Altamaha, down to Darien on the coast." On his return with the 5th Kentucky regiment the men won the warmest approval of the citizens for their good conduct, and for the real immunity which they were enabled to enjoy from the marauding parties of the enemy in their foraging depredations, carrying off provisions and anything else they could use or desired, terrorizing the women of the country.

Col. Hawkins, with the 5th Kentucky, promptly reported to Gen. Lewis, and the 5th Kentucky was with the brigade marching and skirmishing with the enemy until the surrender of Lee and Johnston, when the brigade, at Washington, Georgia, on the afternoon of Saturday, May 6th, 1865, laid by their arms. Paroles were received and the First Kentucky Brigade as an organization, was no more.

REMARKS.

1. Was commissioned Colonel of the Sixth Regiment, Kentucky Infantry, Nov. 1, 1861; assumed command of the 1st Kentucky brigade on the field of Chickamauga, when General Ben Hardin Helm was killed; promoted to Brigadier General to take rank from Sept. 30, 1863 and commanded to the end of the war the Kentucky "Orphan Brigade"; was paroled at Washington, Georgia, May 9, 1865.
2. Was promoted to Colonel, September 30, 1863 on promotion of Col. Joseph H. Lewis to be Brigadier General; was assigned to duty as Provost Marshal General of the Army of Tennessee.
3. Was commissioned Lieutenant Colonel of the Sixth Regiment Kentucky Infantry, Nov. 1, 1861, on the consolidation of the 1st (Cofer's) Battalion, and the companies of the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry.
4. Was promoted successively from 1st Lieutenant of company "D" and Adjutant to Major, on May 10, 1862; promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, Sept. 30, 1863, on promotion of Lieutenant Colonel Cofer to be Colonel; wounded at Dallas, Ga., May 28, 1864.
5. Was commissioned Major of the Sixth Regiment Kentucky Infantry, Nov. 1, 1861, on the consolidation of the 1st (Cofer's) Battalion and the companies of the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry; was on May 10, 1862, assigned to duty on Staff of General Wm. Preston, and subsequently on Staff of General Ben Hardin Helm, as Major and Inspector General, etc.
6. Was promoted to Major of the Sixth Regiment Kentucky Infantry from Captain of Company "B," on December 3, 1863; was among those taken prisoner at Jonesboro, Ga., Sept. 1, 1864.
7. Was first appointed Assistant Surgeon of the Sixth Regiment Kentucky Infantry, December 18, 1861; was promoted to full Surgeon, December, 1862; assigned to duty at the Andersonville, Ga., Military Prison, January, 1864.
8. Was first appointed Assistant Surgeon of the Sixth Regiment Kentucky Infantry, Oct. 5th, 1861 and was promoted to full Surgeon, April 1, 1864 and served with this regiment until the end.
9. Was enlisted as a private in Company "F" and detailed for duty in medical department while at Bowling Green, Ky., and served conspicuously at the front as a medical aid to the Surgeons on the field; was appointed Assistant Surgeon and assigned to regimental staff, April 1, 1864.
10. Temporarily assigned to duty with this regiment.
11. Was a member of regimental staff of 2d Regiment Kentucky Infantry; temporarily assigned to duty with this regiment.

Was appointed Chaplain of the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry, Dec. 1, 1861; resigned, Dec. 1, 1862, and returned to active service in the ranks with company "I" and elected 2d Lieutenant, Dec. 10, 1862; was severely wounded and fell into the hands of the enemy at Intrenchment Creek, Ga., July 22, 1864.
13. Was assigned to duty as Chaplain of the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry, January 16, 1864; had been three times wounded while serving in the cavalry service with General John H. Morgan.
14. Was appointed captain and A. C. S., Oct. 8, 1861; served on the regimental staff at battle of Shiloh, April 6th and 7th and was wounded, April 7, 1862; promoted to Chief Commissary of General John C. Breckinridge's division, Oct. 14, 1862.
15. Was appointed Captain and regimental quartermaster at organization and served in that capacity until May 10, 1862, when he attached himself to Company "I" and was elected 1st Lieutenant; was severely wounded at Resaca, Ga., May 14, 1864; when able for light duty was assigned as Provost Marshal at Americus, Georgia.
16. Was promoted from 2d Lieutenant of Company "B," to be Captain and A. Quartermaster, May 1, 1862; served with the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry until November, 1863, when relieved and went to the department of West Virginia.
17. Was first enlisted in Company "F" and transferred to Company "E"; elected 1st Lieutenant of Company "E," May 10, 1862; wounded and taken prisoner at Murfreesboro, January 2, 1863; when exchanged, was promoted to Captain and Assistant Quartermaster, and Chief of Subsistence, 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry.
18. Was a member of Lieut. Col. Cofer's Battalion and appointed Adjutant of the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry at consolidation, but not confirmed; joined the cavalry service under General John H. Morgan in February, 1862, and afterwards killed in battle.
19. Was promoted to 1st Lieutenant and Adjutant from Company "C," May 10, 1862; advanced to Captain and Assistant Adjutant General on Staff of General Joseph H. Lewis, Feb. 19, 1864.
20. Joined this regiment at Holly Springs, Mississippi, Sept. 18, 1862, having previously served on the Staff of General Ben Hardin Helm; promoted to 1st Lieutenant and Adjutant of the 6th Regiment Kentucky Infantry, October, 1863; wounded at Dallas, Ga., May 28, 1864 and severely wounded and permanently disabled at Intrenchment Creek, July 22, 1864.
21. Was appointed Sergeant Major from Company "B," June 4, 1863; wounded and taken prisoner at Stone River, Dec. 31, 1862.
22. Was appointed Sergeant Major from Company "A," May, 1863; promoted to 1st Lieutenant, and A. D. C. on Staff of General Joseph H. Lewis, Oct., 1863; was killed at Kennesaw Mountain, Ga., June, 1864.
23. Was appointed Sergeant Major from Co. "I," October 23, 1863; was awarded Medal of Honor for gallant and meritorious conduct on the field of Chickamauga, Sept. 20, 1863; wounded at Resaca, May 14, 1864; was acting Adjutant of the mounted command.
24. Was appointed Quartermaster Sergeant from Company "H," June 20, 1862; wounded and permanently disabled at Jonesboro, Ga., Aug. 31, 1864.
25. Was appointed Commissary Sergeant from Company "G," August 31, 1863.

1. Was elected Captain at organization, Oct. 8, 1861; was wounded at Stone River, Dec. 31, 1862 and at Chickamauga, Sept. 20, 1863, and again was severely wounded and disabled at Jonesboro, Ga., Aug. 31, 1864.
2. Was elected 1st Lieutenant at organization, Oct. 8, 1861; was severely wounded at Shiloh, April 7, 1862; fell into hands of enemy; exchanged and appointed regimental commissary, and on detail duty.
3. Promoted to 1st Lieutenant, May 10, 1862, vice Charles Dawson, assigned to duty as regimental commissary, etc.; slightly wounded at Intrenchment Creek, July 22, 1864, returned to duty and continued service.
4. Was elected 2d Lieutenant at organization, Oct. 8, 1861; resigned May 10, 1862; joined Company "C," 2d Kentucky Cavalry.
5. Was elected 2d Lieutenant, May 10, 1862, vice McMekin resigned; wounded at Baton Rouge, La.; continued with command until March, 1864, when sent on special detached service.
6. Was elected 2d Lieutenant at organization, Oct. 8, 1861; mortally wounded at Shiloh, April 7, 1862; died at Crystal Springs, Miss., April 20, 1862.
7. Promoted from ranks to 2d Lieutenant, vice Aull, died; was again promoted to 1st Lieutenant; slightly wounded at Intrenchment Creek, etc.
8. Was wounded at Shiloh, April 7, 1862; appointed 2d Lieutenant, June 15, 1862; returned to ranks, Nov., 1862; transferred to Co. "G," 9th Kentucky Cavalry, April 9, 1863.
