To Whom It May Concern:

Attached are two documents regarding Pvt. George Washington Harvey of the former Indiana 40th Infantry Company D. He died in battle on December 31, 1862 and is buried supposing "Unknown" at the National Battlefield Cemetery. I am his great great nephew.

I started studying genealogy when I was transferred to Detroit by the Gannett/USA TODAY Newspapers. This location gave me the chance to visit my families old home in northern Indiana of Knox, Srarke County, Indiana.

I learnt that my great grandfather had been born about an hour and twenty minutes further south in White County. From there the family tree went to Tippecanoe County the next county south. Through family papers I knew my great grandfather's brothers and sisters names. I started coming across additional news articles, etc. and even found the families old cemetery that was well over grown. I found that due to death of his first two wives that my great great grandfather, Joseph Parnell Harvey, married three times.

Then I came across another member of Joseph Parnell Harvey's siblings, a son named George W. Harvey. The problem was the George Washington Harvey that my father knew died in the 1940s in Chicago, Illinois. Now here was a second George W. Harvey but were both brothers they named the same? They did have different mothers. Mary Ward and Amanda Ward. Not sisters but maybe cousins. To prove his middle name of the first George, as it was lost through time as well as he, I needed to find a paper to prove this fact. I include this paper as an attachment. This attachment also says that Pvt. George Washington Harvey went by his middle name as well during

his life. The second George did not he was known as George. Pvt. George Washington Harvey was killed in battle on December 31, 1862 and two weeks prior on December 13, 1862 the second George was born but probably at that date he had a different name.

In a previous sentence you will take note that I had found the old family cemetery. Actually, it wasn't lost I just did not know about it. Other genealogist of the family did and I still had to meet them. I started to clean the old cemetery up and checked with the Veterans Affairs to see if we could get a marker for Pvt. George W. Harvey. With the proof that I received from the National Archives they agreed to provide a marker since their wasn't any proof that George W. Harvey was actually buried at Stone River still. The family cemetery is now listed as a side link of the Tippecanoe County Genealogy site or you might just type in Old Harvey Farm Cemetery. Pvt. George Washington Harvey's memorial grave is now there and I hope and pray that his remains were entered into the National Cemetery.

I am planning to write a paper about this but wanted to share these events with you as they include the Stone River National Battlefield and Cemetery. History is still happening. Even new stories regarding old soldiers of the Civil War. I can share additional papers if the battlefield would like them.

Died: Stone River Battle, Tennessee, 31 December 1862

Age 20 years: Height 5 feet 5 1/2 inches
Complexion: Light
Eyes: Blue; Hair: light
Occupation: Farmer

Enlisted by: Capt. J. Caste, Term 3 year
Company Muster-in Roll of the 40th organization and dated Indianapolis, Ind. Dec. 31, 1861
Company Remarks:
Was in battle of Shiloh Apr. 7, 1862. At siege of Corinth May 1862. At battle of Perryville Oct. 8, 1862. Was at battle of Stone River Dec. 31, 1862.
Killed in this battle. All effects buried with him.


