Little Rock True Democrat Newspaper Article on the 4th Arkansas CAMP NEAR SHELBYVILLE, TENN.,

January 11th, 1863.

Col. R.H. JOHNSON,

DEAR SIR: - Will you be kind enough to publish in your columns, the following list of killed, wounded and missing, in the 4th Arkansas regiment, in the late battle of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, viz:

Field and Staff, none.

Company A, Lieut [sic] T A Thornton, commanding. Killed – Sergt. [sic] R J Ware; slightly wounded – color bearer, John B Bryant; corporals Mathew Hardon, and John Carr; privates W M Weartherly, John Sillimon, M Johnson, and D M Misinger. Missing – sergt [sic] S A Smith.

Company B, Capt [sic] H J Bonner, commanding. Killed – private W S Fuller; severely wounded, privates N Adams, and W M Brown, W F Norwood, slightly wounded; sergt [sic] R H Davis; privates, J P Grader, and R W Boyce; missing – corporal W B Gibson.

Company C, Lieut [sic] B Gist, commanding. Killed – private J M Pate; severely wounded Lieuts [sic] I J Clinghman, and J M Eikins, sergt [sic] H F Crosson, privates M S Morrison, and J H Woods; slightly wounded private. L Read; missing – privates W Philips, F A Elkins, and B P Feills.

Company D, Capt [sic] Samuel W Mayo, commanding. Severely wounded – S W Mayo; Lieut [sic] John Armstrong; slightly wounded, Lieut [sic] G B M Mereer, private Ingraham Morgan, Missing – private Daniel Henderson.

Company E, Capt [sic] Augustus Kile commanding. Killed – private John Hardin; severely wounded privates J Adams, T Caldwell, J W Ellis, S McRay, J W Foreman, W F Williams, slightly wounded privates S L Betner, Isaac Cox, J G Campbell, J H Higgs, J Price, J J Tucker, M Thompson.

Company F, Capt [sic] J W Lavender, commanding. Killed – serg [sic] J F Garrett; severely wounded Lieut [sic] B P Logan, private R M Simpson, Wm Stuart, F A Chapman, M V Baggs; slightly wounded Lt C D Goodman, sergt's [sic] H M Baker; missing, private W M Scott.

Company G, Capt [sic] B D Brock, commanding. Killed – private J M Vinson; severely wounded Lt J F White, sergt's [sic] T J Haynes, J R Power, A J Alfred, private E N Haddleston; slightly wounded private F M Davis, W N Sanford, M C Huddleston, J K Carpenter.

Company H, Lieut [sic] A N Pirtle, commanding. Killed sergt [sic] S T Ward; severely wounded private J Bates, slightly wounded Lt A N Pirtle.

Company I, commanded by Lt A N Pirtle. Severely wounded – private W R Brewster, M Elom; missing, private J Scott.

Company K, Capt [sic] T A Smith, commanding. Killed – private T J Ainsworth; severely wounded privates J P Haynes, J E Walker, slightly wounded sergt's [sic] J H Adams and J W Raiford, corporal W M Avery, private L B Williamson, missing, private W W Weis.

Most of the wounds are slight, and the wounded will be able to report for duty in a short time. With the exception of those marked "missing" and two or three others, all the wounded have been sent south, and were being well cared for.

To the relatives and friends of the noble "dead" I tender the war sympathies of the regiment.
