Great-grand-parent,s were George Washington Cline and his wife,s name was Carrie E. (Collin,s) he was born April 21<sup>st</sup> of 1843; a minister teacher of the Church of Christ in Bloomington, Ills. to Richmond, Ill, he was consider one of the best Bible scholar,s of today, he preach for fifty some year,s; his frist wife was Carrie (Collin,s) Cline who was born in MeComb, Ohio on March 6<sup>th</sup> 1843; died Jan 29<sup>th</sup> 1903, in this marriage it was two children born and raise named Virgil (who died at early age) and Myrle; he then married again to Adina Keener of Ashland, Ohio; he married Carrie E. Collin,s on April 22<sup>nd</sup> in 1875 in MeComb, Ohio ~~April 22<sup>nd</sup> in~~ by Thomas Madden (Minister of the Gospel)

Great-great-grandparent,s; A.J. Collin,s and his ~~wife~~ wife,s name was Sarah Collin,s had three children named Caroline E. Collin,s who was sixteen year,s old on March 25, 1869; two son,s named william A. Collin,s who was sixteen year,s of age on May 3, 1844; Hudson A.J. Collin,s who was sixteen as of Nov. 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1876; all of this information came from A.J.Collin,s Civil War Record,s that was handed down to me; this man was a Private of the Co.D, 99<sup>th</sup> Reg. of Ohio as of the 11<sup>th</sup> of November of 1862; his wife would or did received eight dollar,s amonth with a addition of two dollar,s a month for each child that they had while were married; this was sign by the Secretary of the Interior (Acting); Countersign by Joseph H. Bawell Commissioner of Pension,s as of March 16<sup>th</sup> 1867; also I have a Circular that is attached to this Pension Certificate stating that the Certificate No. is 8851 given to Sarah Collin,s from the Dept. of the Interior Pension Office in Washington D.C.; May 1, 1886, that she would draw increase of 12.00 per month, commencing March 19<sup>th</sup>, 1886; all of this information is recorded in the Pension Office in Book A., Vol. 4, Page 179; payment,s would be made semiannually to March 4<sup>th</sup> and Sept. 4<sup>th</sup> by W.E. Davis Esq. the Pension Agent; this man is buried at Stone,s River National Cemetery, Grave No. A-174 Murfreesboro, Tenn.; died 11-17-1862, in Silver-Spring, Tenn; I am lucky to have his small Bible, which read,s inside A.J.Collin,s Book bought August 20<sup>th</sup>, 1862, who died Nov. 1862, age 37 year,s, 11 month,s and four day,s is buried in Tenn.; while in the army this was his pocket friend and was received after his death, it was return to me Sarah Collin,s (my great-great-grand-mother) She is buried either in MeComb, Ohio, or ~~MeComb~~ <sup>TOLLA</sup>, Ohio in the Cline and Collin,s Cemetery, in which I have large Picture of.

~~Grand-father~~ ~~Leona Honey~~ (my mother ) was adopted by Ben & Myrle Battenfield at a early age, from Little Rock Children,s Home in Little Rock, Ark. Ben F. Battenfield was born in Napoleon, Ohio March 23<sup>rd</sup> in 1879 in Huerf County, along with four other brother,s named John, Jacob, Samuel, Jermone and one sister (name unknown); he graduated from Transylvania University and College of the Bible in Lexington, Kentuey; he taught school the summer term at Malinta, Ohio, Monroe Township as of Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> 1898; while he was at the University of Kentuey, he became a member of the "Boar Head" Sigma Apton Fraternity as of Feb. 14<sup>th</sup> 1914; I an lucky to have the letter asking him to preach or teach the Bible the Summer term at Malinta, Ohio, Monroe Township as of Feb. 12, 1898. he also taught Bible in Marion County, Ohio in 1898 to 1899, where I have the list of pupil,s that he taught that year; he was also a member of the "Middler,s" Club at the Unversity of Ky. in 1914; also a member of the Social Parity League inthe year of 1912;at same Unversity; I have three very old year-book,s from this college that was handed down to me after the death of my Mother as of 1945. ~~Grand-mother~~ her name was Myrle Carrie Cline born Nov. 30, 1877 in McComb, Ohio; she too attended the Unversity of Kentuey; she married B.F. Battenfield 1899 in McComb, Ohio; she had one brother named Vernon Virgil who was born March 12<sup>th</sup> 1876, died Sept. 20<sup>th</sup> 1890; I have her perfume receipe; several hair pin,s, her handkerchief; and a water Lily that was given to her before she married my Grand-father in a large envelope in the fall of 1899; she had been a Christain woman for eighty year,s, her husband also edited The Kingdom Harbinger for several year,s; they (Battenfield,s) moved from Lexington, Ky. to Ark.; having no children of own these people went to the Ark. Opran,s Home in Little Rock, Ark. where they adopted four girl,s at one time; their name,s are the following Ruth, Leona, (my mother) Gladys, Mildred, all lived on a "goat-dairy", raised sheep and cow,s and my Grand-father still found the time to preach the gospel in the Gilbert, Harrison, Church of Christ; all of t ese<sup>my</sup> received a good education and at this writing onley one is still alive; moved to Miss. in the 40,s because of health reason,s; she died Sept. 25, 1967, buried beside her husband, who died May 3, 1948 in Webster County, Miss. town of Clarkson
