Dear Mr. Brunett:

According to our cemetery records, James Thompson, Private, Company B, 101st Indiana Infantry, is buried in grave #O-6036 in Stones River National Cemetery. He is reported to have died of disease at Murfreesboro on June 15, 1863. That is the only James Thompson listed in our records. Based on the information in your letter, I can't determine if it is the person you seek information about. If you wish to learn more, you can write to the National Archives or the Indiana State Library. Information about each is enclosed, along with a park folder, a cemetery map, and a brief regimental history of the 101st Indiana.

Thank you for the copy of the tin type of James Thompson. We will include it in our regimental file on the 101st Indiana Infantry. If you learn that he was in a regiment other than the 101st, could you please let us know?

Thank you for your interest in Stones River National Battlefield. Good luck with your research.
