

fifty cavalrymen to the disloyal neighborhood with orders to arrest all engaged in the outrage. On the arrival of the cavalry, they were also fired on by the citizens, when they made a charge and, dispersed the rebels, capturing a number of them together with the deserters.

Gov. Moore of Louisiana, has delivered a message in which he says the receipts of the State during the last year were eight million five hundred and ninety two thousand one hundred and seventy-nine dollars, of which five million nine hundred and seventy six thousand seven hundred and forty two dollars came from the sale of six per cent. bonds and treasury notes. The expenses were about two and a half millions, one half for the military fund. For the ensuing year the Governor thinks it will be neither proper nor practicable to depend upon taxation at all, as three fourths of the tax paying portion of the State is in the hands of the enemy. He says, notwithstanding this condition of affairs, the people of Louisiana will never yield.

The renowned and eloquent Bishop Simpson, of the Methodist Church, has been holding a series of Missionary meetings at four of the churches in Washington. They have proved a great success in the attendance, general interest and collections. Three thousand dollars in all have been collected. On Monday morning the Bishop preached to a crowded audience at Foundry church; and among his auditors were the President, Secretaries Chase, Stanton and Seward, as well as a number of Senators and Representatives.
