This order shall become effective on July 1, 1940.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>President Cleveland, on December 7, 1886, reserved the following lands for the National Cemetery of Custer's Battlefield Reservation: "Commencing at a point 1200 feet North 35° west of Custer's Monument, and running thence North 55° East 1200 feet; thence South 35° East one (1) mile; thence South 55° West to the right bank of the Little Big Horn River; thence along said right bank to the prolongation of the Western Boundary; thence along said prolongation to the place of beginning. Area: one square mile."
