


Prophetstown State Park Acquisition, Tippecanoe County, IN

LWCF Funding Assistance: \$910,000

Investing in Indiana's State Parks

Indiana Department of Natural Resources acquired 114 additional acres within Prophetstown State Park for future development as a natural area and passive park. Located along the bluffs and lowlands north of the Wabash River and five miles north of Lafayette, the park contains over 10,000 years of documented Native American history and served as the head-quarters of the nation's most impressive Indian Confederation led by Tecumseh. Plans for the site include natural habitat restoration and development of hiking and biking trails.
