Dear Senators,

Thank you for your April 20, 2023, letter regarding the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) and Harvard's efforts to meet the spirit as well as the requirements of the law and implementation regulations.

While I have asked the leadership of the Harvard Peabody Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology to provide more detailed information to your questions in the attached memorandum, Harvard University recognizes that ancestral remains and cultural items have remained in our museum collections for too long. Like many in the museum and university communities, Harvard has been working to confront the reality of a past in which academic curiosity and opportunity overwhelmed humanity. As an institution, we have apologized for the past collecting practices and we have accelerated our efforts to advance return in a way that is careful, respectful, and expeditious.

Harvard has an unusually large and unique engagement with NAGPRA. Over the university's hundreds-year long history, it has been designated by Congress and by many federal and state agencies as a repository of collections and key partner in the study of America's past. This history of collecting and the geographic breadth of the work have

meant Harvard, through the Peabody Museum, has needed to engage with almost all Tribes across the Nation. We have learned a great deal from these consultations, conversations, and relationships and appreciate the knowledgeable, generous, and thoughtful partners we have met as we strive to fulfil the legal, ethical, and moral imperative of NAGPRA.

I hope the attached is helpful to the Committee on Indian Affairs and to the Committee's important work examining NAGPRA.

Memorandum to the Chair and Member of the Committee on Indian Affairs

At the request of President Lawrence Bacow, I am pleased to provide further information on the implementation of the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act of 1990 ("NAGPRA") at Harvard University. The Peabody Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology ("Harvard Peabody Museum" or "Peabody") has coordinated the university's compliance (reflecting action around the collection at the Peabody and the Warren Anatomical Museum at the Harvard Medical School) with NAGPRA, employing experienced and expert staff who are dedicated to NAGPRA implementation.

Overview

When NAGPRA was enacted the Harvard Peabody Museum cared for more than 10,000 Native American ancestors and many thousands of heirlooms belonging from nearly every state in the Nation. The majority of the collection came from scientists, academics, and others, who worked during the late 19th and first half of the 20th century, mostly "America's" through large-scale archaeological excavation which were often ordered by the Federal government. Harvard was among the most frequent recipients of federal collecting permits at the time.

Since the passage of NAGPRA, there have been significant guidance and requirements, which we have embraced, including an increased weight given to geographic affiliation and the collection and nature of ready documentation. The changes have had significant impact on the nature and pace of implementation of repatriation.

Beyond the change in federal policies, the university itself, under the leadership of President Lawrence H. Bacow, has worked to reform its stewardship of collection and museum sacrosanctity. This includes the formation of the Peabody Museum NAGPRA Advisory Committee in 2020 for review and advice on NAGPRA implementation activities, and the Peabody Faculty Executive Committee in 2019 has provided broad counsel to the Peabody on its relationship to the ethical stewardship of the collection.

In January 2021, Harvard University President Bacow publicly apologized for the university's past privileging of those earlier academic researchers led in Harvard having collected thousands of ancestral remains. The university-wide statement was made alongside a formal apology from the Peabody. President Bacow also announced at the time the formation of a Steering Committee on Human Remains in the University's Museum Collection, to make recommendations for the care of ancestral remains at the university's museums. The Steering Committee's Fall 2022 report made many recommendations, including that the university accelerate its implementation of NAGPRA and the ethical and moral imperative to repatriation. The work of the Committee also advances the stewardship of all ancestral remains at the university, more than half of which are not subject to NAGPRA.

Progress and Resources

In 2001, the Peabody, along with other museums, completed inventory for the ancestral remains that were known at the time, following a process guided by the U.S. Department of the Interior. This involved an extension of the 1995 deadline. During the inventory process, the Peabody was in communication with all 574 federally recognized Indian Tribes and Native Hawaiian People's Organization, as well as many state-recognized tribes and other Native groups. While many of these groups are recognized in historical documents and we have formal recognition at the state level, they do not have status under NAGPRA. We have found many instances where federal recognized Tribes are reading and interpreting the items in their behalf, which can speed the process and make it easier, and support the process. But there is also a significant barrier, and this can create significant obstacles to complete a repatriation of federal recognized tribes.

The following are responses to the questions raised in our April 20, 2023, letter. Certain responses refer to additional documents, and some responses contain exhibits which have been provided to the institution. The university's large collection of historical records require a longer explanation; however, we attempt to provide concise answers where possible.

We have also included examples illustrating our process. These examples represent standard processes as well as details in representative specific cases. From straightforward and complex, from 1993 present, and some times in partnership with heretofore (federal agencies and federal recognized Native American groups), these examples represent the process as it has changed over time since NAGPRA's enactment and provide a brief description of the various factors used in the process. Each case, however, is distinct. The documents have been required by NAGPRA as background for these Notices are publicly available from the National NAGPRA Program, and we are happy to provide further details upon request.

- 1) Please describe in detail how your institution determines if there is “a relationship of shared group identity that may be reasonably traced”⁶ when your institution is determining the cultural affiliation of NAGPRA-eligible items or ancestral remains, and explain how your institution interprets and applies the terms “totality of the circumstances”⁷ and “preponderance of the evidence” when making such determinations.⁸

The university follows the steps detailed in the regulations to determine if the criteria for cultural affiliation are met. Each individual document has details for the particular case and has been submitted by the Peabody to the U.S. Department of the Interior National NAGPRA Program as specified by the regulations.

To determine cultural affiliation, given the scope of the Peabody's collection, we first assess if the ancestor for cultural item is “Native American” as defined in the Act. We then identify the item's relationship to the cultural group and provide the item as “required item” as required under Section 10.9(c) of the NAGPRA regulations. We assess the “readily available” document as well, especially as it relates to genealogy and culture, as outlined in Section 10.2(e)(1). This item is provided to Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations (in all cases require to include Alaska Native Indian Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations) according to Section 10.9(b) of the regulations.

We use interactive lists developed to share information quickly and accessibly with Tribes. We specifically request the Tribe's assessment of the evidence provided and request further information from the Tribe. We then compare our understanding of the Tribe's evidence to the review of the draft report and identify the Tribal representatives.

The nature of the historical collection, which included large scale archaeological excavations

that involve tailoring information means that are multiplicity of vision that may be used to examine and ultimately support the NAGPRA determinations. While perhaps that information is not as cost-effective as ways to incorporate new understandings and knowledge that emerge from consultations with other museums or from information shared by the National NAGPRA office. Some cases are particularly straightforward involving a single Tribe or Nation or Tribal consortium. In other cases information and support specific to Tribal affiliation varies if the Tribal Tribes who have been in a particular area over time.

In these determinations the Probationary reports apply the terms "totality of the circumstances" and "preponderance of evidence" as criteria for the determinations. The "totality" in this case refers to the availability of evidence at the Probationary information from the Tribe(s) in the determination (including kinship biological and anthropological information or expert opinion) in Section 10.2(1). The Probationary reports "preponderance of evidence" as well as the determination indicates that it is more likely than not that this is a shared responsibility.

- 2) Please describe the process your institution undertakes to determine—
 - a. When there is sufficient evidence to proceed with repatriation; and
 - b. When a cultural item or ancestral remain is culturally unidentifiable.

Each NAGPRA case is distinct and an understanding must be developed from straightforward to complex. Consultation frequently results in determinations of cultural affiliation. It provides the opportunity to bring new knowledge and traditional understandings into the process supporting the development and publication of notices of repatriation. There is sufficient evidence to proceed with "repatriation" (as defined in the Act and Regulations) when it is more likely than not that the ancestral remains should be returned to a particular Tribe. If not the determinations point us to the term "disposition" for the return. Each matter must be handled on a case-by-case basis and thus may differ in process as the following examples illustrate:

An example of a particularly straightforward case for cultural affiliation is this 2022 notice to the Chickasaw Nation when a cultural remnant for an ancestor from an unknown location was found in Probationary information:

Another example of a straightforward initial NAGPRA implementation is from the U.S. Department of the Interior to focus on cases where cultural remnant was present in Probationary information and otherwise readily identifiable in terms of cultural affiliation was the repatriation of ancestors from the Pueblo to the Pueblo of Jemez. This repatriation was among the first to take place under NAGPRA comprising 1,921 ancestors and 553 funerary burials:

A traditional consultation to cultural affiliation for ancestors and funerary burials from Moundview, Alabama. When the first inventory was completed, consultation had not resulted in a relationship of shared responsibility for ancestors and funerary burials from the site. Subsequent evidence which is detailed in this follow-up summary under the NAGPRA Regulations' Section 10.13 future applicability process supports both a finding of shared responsibility and identification of items as funerary burials:

3) Please describe the processes and methods your institution uses to gather and utilize Native traditional knowledge when determining the cultural affiliation of NAGPRA-eligible items or ancestral remains.

- 5) Please describe each allegation filed with the National NAGPRA Program regarding your institution's failure to comply with NAGPRA, including a summary of the circumstances and outcomes of the allegation(s).
- a. If your institution requested an informal discussion with the Secretary pursuant to 43 C.F.R. § 10.12(f)(1) in response to an allegation, please provide copies of all documents provided to, or received from, the Secretary in connection with the request.
 - b. If an allegation of your institution's failure to comply with NAGPRA resulted in a notice of a failure to comply, please describe
 - i. the steps your institution took to address the allegation, including the date on which the institution was informed of the allegation;
 - ii. the reason for the allegation, whether or not a request for informal discussion was made or occurred;
 - iii. the final determination of the Department of the Interior and the reason or reasons given for the determination;
 - iv. the court's decision in any appeal your institution filed challenging the Department's determination;
 - v. a civil action, if any, instituted by the U.S. Attorney General against your institution to collect a penalty; and

The university has received no notice of failure to comply with NAGPRA.

In November 2005, members of Hui Malimali N. Kupunohiwi Nei (Hui Malimali) alleged that Harvard's Wa'en Anomikimu eum had the human remains of minimum eight Native Hawaiian individuals and had not completed inventory of the remains of the individuals by November 16, 2005. The university received notice of this allegation on April 28, 2010. In written response to the U.S. Department of the Interior on June 14, 2010, the university described the history of the Wa'en, noting that by 1818 it was no longer functioning as a eum. At the time, Harvard officials believed that the remains were collected by the Wa'en ethnologist and had been permanently lost to the Peabody Museum of Natural History. In 2007, Harvard Medical School hired curator of the Wa'en collection. During his previous work on the collection, he identified portions of the NAGPRA-eligible remains. After learning this, the university immediately began the process of determining if the remains were subject to NAGPRA and, having made this determination, took appropriate steps. On April 20, 2009, the university completed the inventory of the eight individuals whose remains were the subject of the allegation and published Notice of Inventory Completion on May 7, 2009.

On September 16, 2010, the U.S. Department of the Interior concluded that Harvard's failure to inventory the human remains prior to November 16, 2005, was substantial. The Assistant Secretary noted that Harvard's decision to complete the inventory of the remains and its prior to Hui Malimali written allegation. Based on the totality of the evidence, the DOI determined that no civil penalty against the university was warranted. 9

On April 1, 2011, Harvard was notified that the U.S. Department of the Interior is evaluating an allegation that the Peabody may have failed to comply with NAGPRA regulations related to the university's handling of certain Woodbury Collection hair clippings. The university is in touch with the National NAGPRA program and is cooperating with the Department.

- 6) Please describe the process your institution undertakes to complete summaries and inventories pursuant to 43 C.F.R. § 10.8 and 43 C.F.R. § 10.9, including the average length of time for completion and the average length of time to send the required Notice of Intent to Repatriate to the Manager of the National NAGPRA program.
 - a. For each summary prepared by your institution, please explain whether the determination listed in the summary as sacred, possibly sacred, patrimonial or unassociated funerary objects was made by i) museum staff or ii) in consultation with tribal representatives or iii) some combination of (i) and (ii).
 - b. For each inventory prepared by your institution, please explain whether the determination of human remains or associated funerary objects as either culturally affiliated or unaffiliated was made by i) museum staff or ii) in consultation with tribal representatives or iii) some combination of (i) and (ii).

Each summary and inventory include the details for the particular case and have been submitted by the Peabody to the U.S. Department of the Interior National NAGPRA Program as specified by the regulations. Determinations required by NAGPRA and its implementing regulations are made by Peabody staff in consultation with Tribal representatives. Initial work is conducted by staff of Harvard consultants to Harvard or consultants recommended by the relevant Tribe using "readily available information." This information is provided to Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations (in all cases requirements include Alaska Native Indian Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations) according to Section 10.9(b) of the regulations and the Peabody specifically requests a Tribal assessment of the evidence provided and requests further information from the Tribe. We confirm our understanding of the Tribe's evidence by reviewing the draft findings with Tribal representatives.

While each ancestor must be considered individually, consultation usually results in geographical groupings. Groupings can decrease the average length of time for completion of repatriation. The complexity and volume of organizing the groupings for the geographically varied collection at the Peabody significantly impact the process. There were more than 100 unique geographic locations which included nearly every state. As a result of NAGPRA implementation almost 60 sites are now represented and they are the focus of accelerated grouped implementation efforts. The time to prepare summaries and inventories as well as to prepare and send a Notice of Intent to Repatriate to the National NAGPRA Program, differs in each case. A complex example of a multi-year effort proceeding to a Notice of Intent to Repatriate is the consultation for ancestors and funerary belongings from New Jersey which spanned 1998 – 2001. This process took time because the Tribes wanted to coordinate dispositions among nearly 100 museums and large collections:

- 7) Please describe the process your institution undertakes to determine if cultural items or ancestral remains are not culturally affiliated, including the length of time, on average, it takes to notify the Manager of the National NAGPRA program.

Under Section 101 of the regulations, the process typically begins with a large number of affidavits representing Tribal Nations with aboriginal lands discussing how a mutually agreeable disposition will proceed. The regulations' emphasis on geography, rather than shared group identity, means that in some cases more than 5 Tribes, each with an aboriginal land right, have an equal role in deciding a disposition. Tribes have been developing regional groups help streamline the bilateral consultation with relevant Tribes while enabling consultation more forward in an efficient way.

As noted above in the recent example of his work from New Jersey, NAGPRA's emphasis on consultation and respects the pace of implementation. The Peabody follows his requirements and responds to Tribes. Some repairs are accomplished within a few months, but many take longer and span a period of years. However, once a determination is reached the Peabody works expeditiously submit the draft notice to the National NAGPRA office for publication in the Federal Register.

8) Please explain any discrepancies between your institution's estimate of the number of cultural items and culturally unidentifiable remains in your institution's possession or control, and the number reported by the National NAGPRA Program.

Historically, there have been discrepancies between the Peabody's submissions to National NAGPRA and the museum's database. The Peabody regularly checks that the data are accurate and informs staff a National NAGPRA of any errors, which are responded to accordingly.

Discrepancies can be large. For example, National NAGPRA removed museum information from Alabama from its inventory in 2015, and Georgia was not included in its inventory in 2022.

Ongoing consultations can also lead to differences between the Peabody's estimates and the numbers reported to the National NAGPRA database, as there are some delays in updating the database when there are new notices and filings. For example, within the last three years, the Minimum Number of Individuals ("MNI") figures were reduced as additional information during consultation allowed the reassessment of individuals. As part of another consultation, tribal knowledge enabled additional funerary belongings to be identified, and some belongings removed from the culturally unidentifiable category being culturally affiliated.

9) Please provide an inventory of any human remains that are in your possession, but controlled by another agency or institution. Please also note what effort, if any, has been taken to ensure the possession of these items comply with NAGPRA.

With NAGPRA's passage, the Peabody prepared an inventory for all known collections in its possession but controlled by another entity and, to the best of its ability, redetermined which federal agencies had legal control of the individual collections. Agencies which collections are the Peabody, past and present, include the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service; U.S. Department of Defense, Navy; U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service; and the Smithsonian Institution. We note that the Peabody's multiple communication efforts with federal agencies over three decades are available in the public record of these agencies.
