Dear Senators,

Thank you for your April 20, 2023, letter regarding the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) and Harvard's efforts to meet the spirit as well as the requirements of the law and implementation regulations.

While I have asked the leadership of the Harvard Peabody Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology to provide more detailed information to your questions in the attached memorandum, Harvard University recognizes that ancestral remains and cultural items have remained in our museum collections for too long. Like many in the museum and university communities, Harvard has been working to confront the reality of a past in which academic curiosity and opportunity overwhelmed humanity. As an institution, we have apologized for the past collecting practices and we have accelerated our efforts to advance return in a way that is careful, respectful, and expeditious.

Harvard has an unusually large and unique engagement with NAGPRA. Over the university's hundreds-year long history, it has been designated by Congress and by many federal and state agencies as a repository of collections and key partner in the study of America's past. This history of collecting and the geographic breadth of the work have

meant Harvard, through the Peabody Museum, has needed to engage with almost all Tribes across the Nation. We have learned a great deal from these consultations, conversations, and relationships and appreciate the knowledgeable, generous, and thoughtful partners we have met as we strive to fulfil the legal, ethical, and moral imperative of NAGPRA.

I hope the attached is helpful to the Committee on Indian Affairs and to the Committee's important work examining NAGPRA.

Memorandum from the Committee on Indian Affairs
January 20, 2023

At the request of President Lawrence Bacow, I am pleased to provide further information on the implementation of the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act of 1990 (“NAGPRA”) at Harvard University. The Peabody Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology (“Harvard Peabody Museum” or “Peabody”) has coordinated the Native American’s compliance (reflecting action around the collection at the Peabody and the Warren Anthropological Museum at the Harvard Medical School) with NAGPRA, employing experienced and expert staff who are dedicated to NAGPRA implementation.

Overview

When NAGPRA was enacted, the Harvard Peabody Museum cared for more than 10,000 Native American artifacts and many hundreds of heirlooms belonging from nearly every tribe in the Nation. The majority of the collection came from scientists, academic, and other, who worked during the late 19th and first half of the 20th century to “America” through large-scale archaeological excavation which were often funded by the Federal government. Harvard was among the most frequent recipients of federal collections returned at the time.

Since the age of NAGPRA, there have been significant improvements, which we have embraced, including increased weight given to geographic affiliation and the continued release of ready documentation. These changes have had significant impact nationwide and across all tribal entities.

Beyond the changes in federal policy, the Native American leader of President Lawrence Bacow, has worked to transform stewardship of collections and museums across the country. This includes the formation of the Peabody Museum NAGPRA Advisory Committee in 2020 to review and advise on NAGPRA implementation activities, and the Peabody Faculty Executive Committee in 2019 to provide broad consultation on issues related to the ethical stewardship of the collection.

In January 2021, Harvard University President Bacow publicly apologized for the Native American’s privileging of more earlier academic research than led in Harvard having collected hundreds of ancestral remains. The Native American-wide agreement was made alongside a formal apology from the Peabody. President Bacow also announced a timeline for the formation of a steering committee on Human Remains in the University Museum Collection, to make recommendations for the care of ancestral remains at the Native American museums. The steering committee’s Fall 2022 report made many recommendations, including that the Native American acceleration implement a plan of NAGPRA and the ethical and moral imperative to return. The work of the Committee also advanced recommendations for the protection of all ancestral remains at the Native American, more than half of which are now subject to NAGPRA.

Progress and Resources

In 2001, the Peabody, along with other museums, completed its inventory for the ancestral remains that were known at the time, following a process guided by the U.S. Department of the Interior. Prior to this, there involved an extension of the 1995 deadline. During the inventory process, the Peabody was in communication with all 574 federally recognized Indian Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations, as well as many state-recognized tribes and other native groups. While many of these groups are recognized by their tribal culture and may have formal recognition at the state level, they do not have status under NAGPRA. We have used many methods to identify and contact federally recognized Tribes to read and fill out the required forms. However, there is also a significant number of tribal communities and their cultural sites that have not been identified or contacted. This includes many smaller, less well-known tribes and their cultural sites.

The following responses to the questions were received on April 20, 2023, from the University of California, Berkeley. These responses represent a wide range of tribal cultures and circumstances and provide a general overview of how they approach the requirements of NAGPRA.

We have also included examples of illustrations and figures. These examples represent a variety of cases, ranging from simple to complex, from 1993 present, and from specific cases to broader trends. These examples represent the process as it has changed over time since NAGPRA's enactment and provide a brief introduction to the various approaches taken by different institutions.

- 1) Please describe in detail how your institution determines if there is "a relationship of shared group identity that may be reasonably traced"⁶ when your institution is determining the cultural affiliation of NAGPRA-eligible items or ancestral remains, and explain how your institution interprets and applies the terms "totality of the circumstances"⁷ and "preponderance of the evidence" when making such determinations.⁸

The University of California has developed its own criteria for determining cultural affiliation. Each individual case is handled on a particular case-by-case basis and has been submitted to the Peabody Museum of the University of California. The National NAGPRA Program is specifically designed to regulate the handling of Native American cultural resources.

The University of California, like most museums, uses scientific methods to assess the cultural significance of artifacts. We have identified the Peabody Museum's collections, and we assess them according to the requirements of the NAGPRA regulations. We assess the "readily available" cultural items, especially those related to the graph and culture, as well as those listed in Section 10.2(e)(1). This information is provided to Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations (in all cases requiring specific language). The information is provided to Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations according to Section 10.9(b) of the regulations.

We use interactive displays to share information quickly and accessibly with Tribes. We specifically request the Tribe's assessment of the evidence provided and request further information from the Tribe. We recommend undersigned documents to the Tribe's evidence before integrating them into the Tribal representations.

The future of the collection, which included large-scale archaeological excavations,

that involve various tribal organizations means that multiple institutions of various tribal nations may be used to examine and ultimately support the NAGPRA determinations. While it is important that information is not always shared in ways that look for ways to incorporate new or updated information from other sources or from information shared by the National NAGPRA office. Some sources are relatively straightforward in providing information about a single Tribal Nation or Tribal consortium. In other cases, information can support specific Tribal affiliations even if they are multiplicitous tribes who have been in a particular area over time.

In these determinations, the Paboy interpretation applies the term "totality of the circumstances" and "proximity of kinship" as criteria for determining the totality of the information from the Tribe(s) involved at or near the site of the removal or transfer of the remains (oraphically, kinship biology or anthropologically, in terms of oral tradition history or other information or expert opinion) in Section 10.2(e)(1). The Paboy interpretation of "proximity of kinship" as written states that it is more likely than not that the remains belong to a group sharing a common identity.

2) Please describe the process your institution undertakes to determine—

- a. When there is sufficient evidence to proceed with repatriation; and
- b. When a cultural item or ancestral remain is culturally unidentifiable.

Each NAGPRA agency is responsible for running the process of repatriation to the appropriate tribe. Consultation from quantity results in determinations of cultural affiliation. It provides the opportunity to bring new knowledge and traditional understandings into the process supporting the development of a publication of notices available to the public. There is sufficient evidence to proceed with repatriation when it is more likely than not that the ancestor or culture it came from belongs to a particular tribe. If not, the determinations point us to the term "disposition" for the return. Each museum must be based on a case-by-case basis and thus may differ in processes as the following examples illustrate:

An example of a recent activity related to repatriation is this 2022 notice to the Chikasaw Nation where a culture specialist found an ancestor from an unknown location was found in Paboy documentation:

Another example of a recent initial NAGPRA implementation update from the U.S. Department of Interior focuses on a specific tribe whose culture was present in Paboy documentation and involved the repatriation of artifacts from the Peoria, Illinois, and Jemez Pueblo areas. This repatriation was among the largest to take place under NAGPRA, comprising 1,921 artifacts and 553 funerary objects:

A consultation to determine cultural affiliation for artifacts from funerary objects from Mount Vernon, Alabama. When the first inventory was completed, the consultation had not resulted in a relationship of shared identity for the artifacts and funerary objects from the site. Subsequent versions of the report update the application's Section 10.13 future applicability process supports both a finding of shared identity and identification of items as funerary objects: gg

If the consult process does not result in cultural affiliation, the determinants of "cultural identity" are rechecked. When cultural items are considered as culturally identifiable, perhaps following the requirements specified in the NAGPRA regulations, Section 10.11. These requirements specify that cultural items be identified with specific details related to their leaders following traditional Native American practices or from whence they came. If these requirements are removed, if tribes accept the terms, the Peabody relatives recommend from the Secretary of the Interior regarding disposal of such items.

- 3) Please describe the processes and methods your institution uses to gather and utilize Native traditional knowledge when determining the cultural affiliation of NAGPRA-eligible items or ancestral remains.

As emphasized by NAGPRA, cultural context is central to understanding Native traditions and knowledge, which come from the ancestors and are passed down through the results. By direct contact, Peabody NAGPRA staff work closely with firms that handle the remains of Native peoples. Tribes communicate directly with cultural consultants and museums and agencies, and cultural experts work with them to manage their remains.

- 4) Please provide examples of when your institution has used only Native traditional knowledge to culturally affiliate NAGPRA-eligible items or ancestral remains.

Even if the number of cases of death related to NAGPRA's definition of cultural property has been few, it has been persistent. At the university, the history faculty collect scholarly research articles, and the director of the relevant department is responsible for determining whether or not "readily identifiable," usually means there will be documentation of the kind of specific case.

5) Please describe each allegation filed with the National NAGPRA Program regarding your institution's failure to comply with NAGPRA, including a summary of the circumstances and outcomes of the allegation(s).

- a. If your institution requested an informal discussion with the Secretary pursuant to 43 C.F.R. § 10.12(f)(1) in response to an allegation, please provide copies of all documents provided to, or received from, the Secretary in connection with the request.

- b. If an allegation of your institution's failure to comply with NAGPRA resulted in a notice of a failure to comply, please describe
 - i. the steps your institution took to address the allegation, including the date on which the institution was informed of the allegation;
 - ii. the reason for the allegation, whether or not a request for informal discussion was made or occurred;
 - iii. the final determination of the Department of the Interior and the reason or reasons given for the determination;

The university has received notice of failure to comply with NAGPRA.

In November 2005, members of Hui Mal ma i N Kupun O H w i'i Nei (Hui Mal ma) alleged that Harvard University violated Article 1 of the Humanitarian Convention of minimum eight Native Hawaiians individually and had not complied in violation of the remainder of the Convention by November 16, 2005. The university received notice of the allegation on April 28, 2010. In response, the Department of the Interior on June 14, 2010, concluded that the university had violated the Convention. At the time, Harvard officials believed that it had been compliant because it had not long been functioning as a major non-profit educational institution. However, Harvard believed that it had violated the Convention "ethnologically" by being predominantly English-speaking and not fully bilingual in its teaching and administration. In 2007, Harvard Medical School hired a consultant to review its collection. During this process, it was discovered that the collection, identified as being in the possession of the university, contained approximately 11,000 items. After being informed of this, the university immediately began to prepare to mine the collection for items related to NAGPRA. A mine plan was submitted to the National NAGPRA Program, which was approved. On April 20, 2010, the university completed its inventory of the collection, identifying approximately 8,000 items. The university has since published a Notice of Inventory Completion on March 7, 2010.

On September 16, 2010, the U.S. Department of the Interior concluded that Harvard had failed to comply with Article 1 of the Convention by November 16, 2005, without notice. The Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs concluded that Harvard had failed to comply with Article 1 of the Convention by failing to provide evidence of the remainder of the Convention. The DOI determined that a civil penalty of \$100,000 would be imposed. 9

On April Harvard was notified that the U.S. Department of the Interior is evaluating an allegation that the Peabody may have failed to comply with NAGPRA regulations related to the university's handling of certain Woodbury Collection hair clippings. The university is in touch with the National NAGPRA program and is cooperating with the Department. g

- 6) Please describe the process your institution undertakes to complete summaries and inventories pursuant to 43 C.F.R. § 10.8 and 43 C.F.R. § 10.9, including the average length of time for completion and the average length of time to send the required Notice of Intent to Repatriate to the Manager of the National NAGPRA program.
 - a. For each summary prepared by your institution, please explain whether the determination listed in the summary as sacred, possibly sacred, patrimonial or unassociated funerary objects was made by i) museum staff or ii) in consultation with tribal representatives or iii) some combination of (i) and (ii).
 - b. For each inventory prepared by your institution, please explain whether the determination of human remains or associated funerary objects as either culturally affiliated or unaffiliated was made by i) museum staff or ii) in consultation with tribal representatives or iii) some combination of (i) and (ii).

Each summary and inventory include the details for the particular case and have been submitted by the Peabody to the U.S. Department of the Interior National NAGPRA Program as specified by the regulations. Determinations required by NAGPRA and its implementation regulations are made by Peabody staff in consultation with Tribal representatives. Initial work is conducted by staff of Harvard consultants to Harvard or consultants recommended by the relevant Tribe using "readily available information." This information is provided to Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations (in all cases requirements include Alaska Native Indian Tribes and Native Hawaiian organizations) according to Section 1 .9(b) of the regulations and the Peabody specifically requests a Tribal assessment of the evidence provided and requests further information from the Tribe. We confirm our understanding of the Tribe's evidence by reviewing the draft findings with Tribal representatives.

While each ancestor must be considered individually consultation usually results in a group. Grouping can decrease the average length of time for completion of repatriation. The complexity and volume of or analyzing the groups for the ethnographically varied collection at the Peabody significantly impact the process. There were more than 1 unique ethnographic locations which included nearly every state. As a result of NAGPRA implementation almost 6 sites are now represented and they are the focus of accelerated grouped implementation efforts. A table listing the number of ethnographic localities by state is attached and available at this [link](#).

The time to prepare summaries and inventories as well as to prepare and send a Notice of Intent to Repatriate to the National NAGPRA Program, differs in each case. A complex example of a multi-year effort proceeding to a Notice of Intent to Repatriate is the consultation for ancestors and funerary belongings from New Jersey which spanned 199 – 2011. This process took time because the Tribes wanted to coordinate dispositions among nearly 1 museums and large collections:
