



“America The Beautiful” - National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass Program



Participating Federal Agencies



The “America The Beautiful” - National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass Program combines the benefits of previous recreation passes from five federal agencies, the National Park Service, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the

Bureau of Reclamation, and the U.S. Forest Service, into one comprehensive pass. The new program replaces the Golden Eagle, Golden Age, and Golden Access Passports, and the National Parks Pass, all of which remain valid until expired, lost, or stolen.

Details of Interagency Pass Program

The Interagency Passes are good at vehicle-based entry sites for all occupants in a single, non-commercial vehicle. At walk-up sites, the passes are good for the pass holder and three adults (total of four adults). There is no charge for children under 16. The new Interagency Passes will be available at federal recreation sites that charge entrance and standard amenity fees, through government internet sites, and through select third-party vendors. These passes are non-refundable, non-transferable, and cannot be replaced if lost or stolen.

The five different Interagency Passes are:

- 1) \$80 Annual Pass -- For anyone visiting federal recreation sites, the pass offers unlimited coverage of entrance and standard amenity recreation fees for a specific period of time, typically a year, beginning from the date of first use.
- 2) \$10 lifetime Senior Pass -- For U.S. citizens and permanent residents 62 years of age or over.

- 3) FREE lifetime Access Pass -- For U.S. citizens and permanent residents with permanent disabilities.
- 4) FREE annual Volunteer Pass -- For volunteers acquiring 500 hours of service on a cumulative basis, beginning January 1, 2007.
- 5) FREE Military Pass -- For active-duty members of the US Military and their dependents.



Where to find Interagency Pass

The annual “America the Beautiful” Interagency Pass can be purchased from the U.S. Geological Survey Store by calling 1-888-ASK-USGS (275-8747), through their website at store.usgs.gov/pass, from federal recreation sites that charge entrance and standard amenity fees, and from select third-party vendors. Senior and Access Interagency Passes can be obtained in person from federal recreation sites that charge entrance and standard

amenity fees and by mail. Volunteer Interagency passes are obtained through the volunteer’s supervisor.
