River Readings

Children are naturally curious about the world around them. The program River Readings is for children in Pre-K through 2nd grade. They will learn about plants, insects and wildlife that can be found in the Upper Delaware River Valley. Children will explore these areas through stories and hands-on activities.



River Readings will take place every Thursday morning at 10:30am beginning July 8, 2010 and will run through August 19th. The program will be held at the historic Zane Grey Museum in Lackawaxen, PA. Children will sit under the shade of maple trees where once famed western writer Zane Grey lived and wrote.

Backyard Biology

The wonder of the Upper Delaware Valley often captures the interest of young children. This program, for 2nd to 5th grade students, seeks to develop their interests even further and act as a catalyst for life-long learning. Rangers will guide the participants through experiments related to plant development, density, and the food web. The program will also include art projects and games related to fish and wildlife.



Backyard Biology will take place every Wednesday morning at 10:30am beginning July 7, 2010 and running through August 18th. The program will take place in the backyard of the Zane Grey Museum in Lackawaxen, PA.
