The White House Visitor Center will close for rehabilitation on July 22, 2012. A temporary visitor center will open at 7:30 am on July 28, 2012. Rehabilitation work will provide an improved experience for visitors, including new interactive exhibits, a model of the White House, a new theatre and book store.

The temporary visitor center with White House Historical Association gift shop will be located across 15th Street at the Ellipse Visitor Pavilion, just west of the intersection of E and 15th streets, NW.
