- Check-in begins at 8:20 am at the Small Missile Range Gate on Highway 70 West between mile markers 174 and 175 (approximately 25 miles south of the visitor center).
- The tour leaves promptly at 9:00 am. If you arrive after 9:00 am, you will not be able to join the tour.
- Fees for the tour are \$8 per adult (16 & older) and \$4 per child (15 & under). There are no discounts for federal pass holders. Fees will be collected at the start of the tour. Exact change is appreciated.

Mandatory Safety Requirements

- You will caravan in your own car from the gate to the trailhead (17.5 miles one way). Have a full tank of gas before leaving home.
- No sandals or open-toed shoes. Closed-toed shoes are required.
- The tour is three hours long, two of which will be outside. Bring plenty of water (*one gallon per person suggested*), snacks, sunscreen, hats, and sunglasses for everyone in your group. Dress according to weather.
- This moderate hike to the lake shore and back is 1.5 miles over rough terrain and loose soils. This tour is not wheelchair accessible.
- Pets are welcome as long as they are friendly, remain on a leash, and you clean up after them.
