DESCRIPTION Photograph album depicting a camping party through Yellowstone National Park in 1898.

The album contains 24 black & white photographic prints with brief captions.

The photographs depict a variety of the geothermal and natural features of Yellowstone National Park as well as several images of the camping party. Geothermal features shown include Liberty Cap, Pulpit Terrace, Orange Geyser, Giant Geyser, Grotto Geyser, Castle Geyser, Riverside Geyser, Mortar Geyser, Restless Geyser, and Devil's Punchbowl. Other landscapes shown are Golden Gate, Yellowstone River, Gibbon Falls, Iron Spring Creek, Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, and Point Lookout. The photographs also depict the mess wagon, "Old George" the horse, a picnic, tents at a campsite, and Fort Yellowstone (WY).
