DESCRIPTION Photograph album of trips to Yellowstone National Park by schoolteacher Katherine Holland in 1936 and 1938. The album consists of 11 loose pages of black construction paper with photographs, commercial postcards, and ephemera affixed with adhesive.

Topics depicted are primarily geographic and thermal features. Original photographs depict the geysers Old Faithful, Lone Star, Riverside, Grotto, and Lakeside; thermal features Angel and Jupiter Terraces and the Fountain Paint Pots; and landscapes of the Great Falls of the Yellowstone, Yellowstone Lake, Tower and Moose Falls, Firehole Cascades, and a bear along the road. Although a couple snapshots include people, none are identified. There are also a series of Haynes Studios, Inc. postcards depicting geysers such as Old Faithful, Grand, Daisy, Giant, Grotto, Riverside, Oblong, Castle, Sponge, Punch Bowl, and the Upper Geyser Basin. Also shown are the Old Faithful Inn, Kepler Cascades, Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, and Emerald, Crested, and Sapphire Pools. There are also a few pieces of ephemera including a mileage card from the YMCA Cafe in Pocatello, Idaho, a news clipping about a recent engagement in which Holland served as attendant, and clippings from magazines of Dr. Julietta Arias of Panama and a Mrs. Barnes. The album is an example of the typical scrapbook compiled by an early 20th century visitor mixing personal and commercial views to record the visit.
