***HISTORY***

Alice C. and Paul L. Albright, Sr. were professional photographers in Cheyenne, Wyoming, in the 1940s. The family, along with son Paul, vacationed in Yellowstone and Grant Teton National Parks before and after World War II.

***DESCRIPTION***

The collection consists of photographs of Yellowstone National Park by professional photographers Alice C. and Paul L. Albright, Sr. in the 1940s. The mostly 8 x 10 black and white prints depict common visitor views such as the Old Faithful Inn; geysers; waterfalls such as the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone; wildlife such as bear and deer; and visitor activities such as camping. There are also several images from Grand Teton National Park, including the Church of Immaculate Conception. Most images are labeled on the verso. The collection is notable for the quality of views, documentation around the war years, and the availability for use.
