HISTORY

The purpose of Entre Nous is to support youth activities in the community of Gardiner, Montana. Established in the late 1940s, members originally served as Girl Scout Leaders and sponsored other youth organizations. The club owns and manages the Scout House, used by local Boy and Girl Scout troops for meetings and by Gardiner residents for events and activities. The organization holds fundraisers throughout the year to fund operation and maintenance of the building. Monthly meetings generally include games of pinochle.

The club partnered with the Gateway Hose Company and the Gardiner Fire Department for many years. Entre Nous joined the Gardiner Chamber of Commerce in 2000.

The records include a short history, member lists, and administrative information. There are also several editions of the club's constitutions, by-laws, meeting minutes, and thank you notes and letters of support for the club and their assistance to the local Girl Scout Troop. Also included in this collection are various Scout House schedules and user-agreements as well as a list of items sold from Little Whiffers—the proceeds of which were given to the Entre Nous Club. There are also three scrapbooks created by the club which include photographs, notes, game cards, and other ephemera. Also included are clippings from the Park County News focusing on the Entre Nous Club and Boy and Girl Scout events in the community.</p>
