HISTORY

Truman Ward Ingersoll was a professional photographer who visited Yellowstone National Park numerous times in the late 19th and early 20th century. He produced many stereoviews for sale, including a boxed set with an accompanying guidebook.

DESCRIPTION

Negatives, copy prints, and photographic slides by photographer T. W. Ingersoll of Yellowstone National Park 1883-circa 1910. Many of the images are typical tourist views of geysers, landscapes, waterfalls, and lakes. There are also images of visitors, including a few of President Teddy Roosevelt's 1904 visit. The commercial stereoviews and guidebook are not included in this collection; some may be found in other collections within the Heritage & Research Center.
