HISTORY

The maps and drawings collection documents diverse events, actions, and functions of Yellowstone National Park that spans its history. The following collection history reflects this diversity of materials. More specific histories can be found in the collections mentioned in the associated materials section.

1870: General Henry Dana Washburn and Lieutenant Gustavus C. Doane conducted the first major expedition of Yellowstone by mapping the Upper Geyser Basin and Lake areas.

1871-1872: USGS Geologist Ferdinand Vandeveer Hayden further documented the natural landscapes and geological features of Yellowstone.

1872: Early surveys helped influence advocacy for special protection of the Yellowstone region, and eventually prompted the designation of Yellowstone as the world's first national park.

1872-1886: Civilian superintendents oversaw the administrative control of park operations.

1883: Roads in Yellowstone remained crude and undeveloped until the US Army Corps of Engineers appointed Lieutenant D.C. Kingman to survey a general road system in 1883. His efforts produced a proposal of a linked system that brought tourists into the park from boundary towns to points of interests, yet preserved the natural aspects of the park.

1884: Frank Haynes opened a photography studio in Mammoth.

1886: Captain Moses Harris of the 1st US Cavalry, Company M relieved civilian superintendents of administrative control of Yellowstone due to continued degradation of park resources by poachers, concessioners, and tourists. The US Army established its administrative base at Fort Yellowstone in the Mammoth area of the park. The Army and the U.S. Corps of Engineers led surveys, construction projects, and oversaw the protection of the park for the next three decades.

1890-1905: Captain Hiram Chittenden built on Kingman's vision with Project Beltline of the 1890s, which connected major areas of the park with roads and an expanded trail system. These initiatives laid the groundwork for the eventual park-wide Grand Loop Road system of Yellowstone. Chittenden continued to build on this developing system with increased federal funding for road development in the early 1900s, and left a considerable engineering legacy with the construction of projects such as the Golden Gate viaduct, Mount Washburn Road, and Dunraven Pass from Canyon to Mammoth Hot Springs.

1898: Harry W. Child formed the Yellowstone Park Transportation Company, and later acquired concessioner services throughout the park.

1902-1904: President Harry W. Child of Yellowstone Park Company (YPC) and the Northern Pacific Railroad commissioned Robert C. Reamer to design the Old Faithful Inn, the Northern Pacific Railroad Depot, and make major renovations to the Lake Hotel. Reamer completed this work between 1903 and 1904.

1907: 1st Lieutenant Ernest Peek replaced Hiram Chittenden and continued improvements on the Grand Loop project. The Army maintained the responsibility for Yellowstone's road system until the establishment of the National Park Service in 1916.

1910-1911: Robert C. Reamer replaced the old Canyon Hotel with a new hotel.

1915: Charles Hamilton founded Hamilton Stores.

1916: The National Park Service (NPS) was established and appointed Stephen Mather as first director. By 1918, the NPS fully replaced the army as the park's administrative authority.

1920: Park Superintendent Horace M. Albright appointed Ranger Milton Skinner as Yellowstone's first naturalist to conduct tours and lecture on the park's natural features. A museum was established in the Bachelor Officers' Quarters at Mammoth. Both actions marked a key point in developing the interpretative and educational legacy of Yellowstone.

1926: The expansion of Yellowstone roads and trails saw only minor momentum in the years following the military period of the park. The National Park Service administration lacked resources to fund major development projects. In 1926, the Bureau of Public Roads of the US Department of Agriculture took on the responsibility of developing the Yellowstone National Park Highway System, which expanded the Grand Loop.

1926-1936: Robert C. Reamer returned to Yellowstone and made major renovations and additions to Old Faithful Inn, Lake Hotel, Canyon Hotel, and Mammoth Hotel.

1929: A dedicated Wildlife Division for surveying and studying flora and fauna was established at Yellowstone, due to the insistent support of National Park Service Director Horace M. Albright and the financial support of biologist George M. Wright.

1930s: As part of the New Deal, Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) workers took part in fire management, roads, trails, and facilities development projects.

1935-1936: The fire management and insect disease control practices of brush removal and clear cutting that the NPS had adopted from the U.S. Forest Service faced criticism from biologists, who argued that fires restored the ecosystem, and controlled burns should replace clear cutting. Despite criticisms, however, clear cutting remained the accepted practice until the late 1960s.

1936: The Yellowstone Park Boat Company, Yellowstone Park Transportation Company, Yellowstone Park Hotel Company, and Yellowstone Park Lodge and Camps Company, all previously acquired by Harry W. Child, consolidated to form the Yellowstone Park Company with William Nichols as president.

1940: The National Park Service transferred Yellowstone Wildlife Division biologists to the U.S. Bureau of Biological Survey, despite their successful efforts in surveying and identifying major problems for wildlife management in Yellowstone. Their research produced vital scientific data on the northern elk herd, bison migrations, bear management, and issues related to park fisheries.

1940s: The World War II era saw curtailment in construction projects, scientific research, and interpretation resources due to the demand of labor and resources for the defense effort.

1956-1966: The post-war period brought increased usage of roads and trails, and the NPS sought expansion of visitor facilities, interpretive devices, roads, bridges, and trails through the ten year Mission 66 project. The National Park Service gave core responsibility to the Yellowstone Park Company to develop Canyon Village, Grant Village, and Bridge Bay.

1959-1971: John and Frank Craighead revolutionized wildlife study by using radio telemetry, radio collars, tranquilizers, and tagging methods to study Yellowstone's grizzly population.

1965-1966: Yellowstone Park Company's contract faced termination due to failure to upgrade and expand facilities. To avoid termination, YPC sold the company to General Host, Inc.

1965-1968: The National Park Service changed their philosophy of fire management and insect disease control based on clear cutting, brush removal, and the use of insecticides. Instead, their policy focused on controlled burns and letting natural fires burn to restore ecosystems.

1967: National Park Service biologists embraced a controversial wildlife management philosophy of "natural regulation" that discouraged human intervention to control animal populations, such as the commonly practiced reductions utilized to control the Yellowstone Northern Elk herd. This also influenced bear management policies in the park and nationwide National Park Service wildlife management policies.

1960s and 1970s: The U.S. Department of Transportation Federal Highway Administration took over responsibility for rehabilitating and upgrading park roads and bridges.

1967: Hamilton Stores bought Haynes Studios.

1979: General Host, Inc. lost its concessions contract, due to failure to upgrade facilities and services. Trans World Airlines Services, Inc. (TWA) wins the new contract.

1984: Trans World Airlines Services, Inc. changed name to Trans World Services, Inc. (TW), and again in 1988 to Trans World Recreational Services, Inc.

1988: Extreme drought, high winds, and storms prompted the largest forest fire in park history. The fire engulfed Yellowstone and adjoining forests, resulting in 120 million acres burned.

1993: The Yellowstone Center for Resources (YRC) was established to manage natural and cultural resources, and administer scientific research permits in the park.

1995: Amfac Parks and Resorts bought Trans World Recreational Services, Inc., and eventually changed their name to Xanterra Parks and Resorts.

2002: Hamilton Stores ceased operation in Yellowstone, ending 80 years of concessioner services.

DESCRIPTION This collection contains maps, architectural drawings, and engineering drawings that document multiple events, functions, and activities of Yellowstone National Park.

Among these holdings are the first Yellowstone surveys of the 1870s by General Henry Dana Washburn, Lieutenant Gustavus C. Doane, and Geologist Ferdinand Vandever Hayden. In addition, there are surveys from the 1886-1918 military era of the park that document Fort Yellowstone and major construction and engineering projects conducted by the U.S. Army and U.S. Corps of Engineers, including projects by prominent engineer Captain Hiram Chittenden. Maps and drawings also detail the first concessioner hotels, facilities, stage coach lines, and rail lines.

There are also maps, drawings, and other papers relating to major planning and development programs by the National Park Service at Yellowstone, such as park wide Master Plans or the Mission 66 project. Annotated maps, studies, and management plans document the resource management functions of Yellowstone. A large portion of the collection documents facilities and maintenance activities with engineering and architectural plans for roads, trails, buildings, and utilities. This includes some of the park's more significant projects, such as the construction of Old Faithful Inn by architect Robert C. Reamer or the completion of Grand Loop Highway System.

Exhibit concept designs, and plans for interpretive devices document the interpretation and education functions of Yellowstone. Lastly, fire progression maps, reports, and atlases detail the fire management functions of Yellowstone, and document the major 1988 Fire.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

I. SERIES I: MILITARY ERA MAPS AND DRAWINGS, 1870-1917

The series contains maps, drawings, and blueprints. The bulk of the series comes from the US Army and the US Army Corps of Engineers at Fort Yellowstone near Mammoth Hot Springs. Other maps and drawings originate from the first park concessioners and railways that operated in or around the park. The materials in this series date from the time around the establishment of Yellowstone National Park in 1872, when civilian superintendents held administrative control, as well as the military administration period of 1886-1918.

A. SUBSERIES A: LAND SURVEYS, 1870-1917

Files are arranged by geographic area or project, and thereunder chronologically by year.

This subseries contains blueprint and photocopied maps from the US Geological Survey (USGS), and the US Army Corps of Engineers at Yellowstone National Park. The earliest maps are copies of the Yellowstone Expedition, 1870, and geological surveys of Yellowstone Lake and Yellowstone Park, 1871, led by USGS Geologist Ferdinand Vandever Hayden. Later maps consist of surveys by the US Army Corps of Engineers for Fort Yellowstone, Mammoth Hot Springs, and Gardiner led throughout the period of 1901-1917 by Lieutenant A.R. Jones, Captain Wieder Willing, 1st Lieutenant Ed Peeks, and Captain Hiram Chittenden.

B. SUBSERIES B: ROADS, 1892-1916, undated

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This subseries contains blueprint, linen, and photocopied maps of major road development projects. The bulk of the maps consist of the park-wide road projects led by Captain Hiram Chittenden of the US Corps of Engineers in 1905. Other maps include Project Beltline of the 1890s, road and bridge projects led by Lieutenant D.C. Kingman of the US Corps of Engineers, and administrative road, bridge, and utility progression maps from 1912 and 1916.

C. SUBSERIES C: BUILDINGS, 1885-1909, undated

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This subseries consists of maps, architectural drawings, and blueprints of the first structures built in Yellowstone National Park. This includes buildings at Camp Sheridan and Fort Yellowstone located in the Mammoth Hot Springs area, such as the Quarters for Field Officers and the Hydroelectric Power Plant. Blueprints of the first concessioner run park hotels include: Mammoth Hotel, Cottage Hotel, Norris Hotel, Fountain Hotel, Old Faithful Inn, Thumb Lunch Hotel, Lake Hotel, Canyon Hotel, and Shack Hotel.

D. *SUBSERIES D: CONCESSIONERS AND PARTNERS, 1885-1915, undated*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This subseries contains maps and blueprints. Area maps of Hotel Terrace of Mammoth Hot Springs and Forks of Firehole River show concessioner leases and facilities, such as F. Jay Hayden Photography, and geographic areas leased by James A. Clark and George W. Marshall. Maps of the permanent campsites for the Wylie Camp Company and the Shaw and Powell Camping Company are also included. The subseries also consist of stage coach route maps from the Monida and Yellowstone Stage Line, proposed lines from the Union Pacific Railway, and a proposed Inclined Railway for Grand Canyon.

II. *SERIES II: MANAGEMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY, 1881-2009, undated*

The maps and drawings included in this subseries focus on the administrative functions of planning, compliance, and long-term development initiatives for Yellowstone National Park.

A. *SUBSERIES A: MASTER PLANS, 1932-1971*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries includes complete and incomplete volumes of Yellowstone National Park Master Plans. The plans consist of park-wide maps, area maps, charts, and architectural drawings that outline long-term development plans. Complete plans are available for the years: 1932, 1933, 1939, 1940, 1941, 1952, 1954, 1963, and 1965. Incomplete plans include volumes or working files kept and organized by the Chief Ranger, the Engineering Office, and unknown sources, which span the 1950s and 1960s. One file is reconstructed chronologically for the years 1948-1963. The developing authority of the master plans changed over time. The Branch of Plans and Design drafted master plans from 1932-1941. The Landscape and Architectural Division within Yellowstone created plans from 1948-1954. Lastly, the Western Office of Design and Construction oversaw plans from 1963-1965.

The sub-subseries also contains architectural drawings from Mission 66 in the master plans for 1956 and separate drawings for the restoration of Norris Soldier Station in 1965. Mission 66 sought to upgrade and expand visitor facilities and amenities at NPS sites and parks across the country in a period of ten years. In Yellowstone, the park administration partnered with the Yellowstone Park Company (YPC) to develop Bridge Bay Marina, Canyon Village, and Grant Village. With the exception of Canyon Village, the majority of Yellowstone Park Company projects never materialized, and the park administration cancelled remaining YPC projects in 1964. Other Mission 66 projects were completed, such as the above mentioned Norris Soldier Station restoration.

B. *SUBSERIES B: WINTER USE, 1985, 2006-2009*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries consists of maps, charts, and oversize hand drawn presentation posters regarding winter use of Yellowstone National Park, including snowmobiles, snow coaches, and other recreational activities. The material also focuses on the debate over the environmental impact of winter use, and outlines past winter use plans, regulations, and possible scenarios for future use.

C. *SUBSERIES C: BOUNDARIES, 1881-1994, undated*

Files are arranged by geographic area or boundary, and then chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries consists of maps, overlays, and oversize textual records. Copies and originals of Yellowstone land deed and land ownership status records are available, including the additions and adjustments of park boundaries for the years: 1905, 1923, 1943, 1945, 1960, and 1978. Annotated USGS maps and other original maps also detail boundary adjustments and additions. Maps and town ownership sheets provide boundary details of surrounding towns and communities of Yellowstone.

III. *SERIES III: RESOURCE MANAGEMENT, 1878-2002, undated*

The maps and drawings in this subseries focus on surveys and projects conducted to maintain and manage the natural, cultural, and historical resources of Yellowstone National Park.

A. *SUBSERIES A: MULTIDISCIPLINARY PROJECTS, 1965*

This sub-subseries contains the broad-based and multidisciplinary Natural Resource Management Plan of 1965 for Yellowstone, which details management plans for disease and insect control, blister rust, wildfires, wildlife, geologic and thermal features, aquatics, and park usage. The plan consists of Mylar plastic overlays, maps, photographs, and typed text on onion skin paper.

B. *SUBSERIES B: GEOLOGY, 1878-2002*

Files are arranged by geographic area and thereunder chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains hand drawn, annotated, oversize, and printed maps of geological features of Yellowstone. The bulk of the maps consists of surveys done over multiple years for the thermal areas of the park, such as Lower, Midway, and Upper Geyser Basins; Fountain; Mammoth Hot Springs; West Thumb; Potts Hot Springs Basin; Mud Volcano; and Norris, Shoshone, and Monument Geyser Basins. Topographic, bathymetric, and geodetic survey maps detail geological features park-wide for 1980, 1987, and 2001. Seismograph sheets, charts, and maps show the seismicity and earthquake history of Yellowstone for the years: 1959, 1973-1981, and 1985.

C. *SUBSERIES C: WEATHER, 1975, 1991*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains annotated USGS maps of storm systems and U.S. Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation Service maps that track average annual snowfall and 50 year frequency snow fall totals of Yellowstone National Park.

D. *SUBSERIES D: FISHERIES AND AQUATICS, 1937-1989*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries consists of hydrographic and bathymetric maps of Yellowstone Lake, Bridge Bay Lagoon, and Duck Lake. The sub-subseries also contains a sounding study, prehistoric lake level map for Yellowstone Lake, and engineering drawings of fish traps for Lake Yellowstone.

E. *SUBSERIES E: WILDLIFE, 1918-1992, undated*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains hand drawn maps, annotated maps, printed maps, and charts that pertain to management and overall health of wildlife populations in Yellowstone National Park. Engineering drawings of buffalo crates, elk crates, and elk traps detail implements used to maintain and reduce populations. The bulk of maps show migration routes, range locations, and census data for elk, bison, coyotes, and big horn sheep for scattered years. Charts show fetal weights and average weights for elk from 1962-1965. Grizzly bear management maps show habitat and transplant locations in Yellowstone for 1964-1965, and 1970-1971.

F. *SUBSERIES F: VEGETATION, 1924-1988, undated*

Files are arranged by geographic area or project, and thereunder chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains hand drawn, annotated, and printed maps of vegetation of Yellowstone, and issues related to vegetation, such as insect infestation, disease, and invasive species. The bulk of maps consist of park-wide working maps and management plans of blister rust control for the years 1938 and 1948-1975. Volumes of forest type maps and vegetation management plans detail vegetation in all areas of the park from 1930-1936. Invasive species surveys for Dalmatian toadflax, bindweed, spotted knapweed, and dwarf mistletoe cover scattered years. Annotated USGS maps of insect aerial surveys for mountain pine beetle, budworm, sawfly, and other insects span the years 1961-1988.

G. SUBSERIES G: ARCHEOLOGY, 1967-1996, undated

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains annotated maps, printed maps, overlays, and inventory lists that detail archeological sites and cultural resources of Yellowstone. Archeological base maps and resource inventories conducted by the Midwest Archeological Center and other unknown sources cover 1971, 1979, 1984, 1992, 1993, and undated years. Other maps involve major Indian encampment sites, and drilling sites.

The materials contained in this sub-subseries are subject to access restrictions due to the following federal laws: National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) and Archeological Resources Protection Act (ARPA). Access must be approved by the Archivist.

H. SUBSERIES H: HISTORY, 1928-1999

Files are arranged chronologically by the year of research or reproduction.

This sub-subseries contains annotated maps, photocopied maps, and prints with notes utilized for the purposes of historical research by Yellowstone historians, and other researchers. The maps document major events that occurred in Yellowstone. Photocopied maps and prints include the Dougherty Map, 1811, and Department of Columbia Map of the Nez Perce Indian Campaign, 1877. Annotated maps include routes of the following major Yellowstone expeditions: Colter, 1807; DeLacy, 1863; Folsom-Cook, 1869; Washburn-Langford-Doane, 1870; Barlow-Heaps-Hayden, 1871; Hayden, 1872; and Jones-Comstock, 1873 as well as the 1877 Nez Perce route across Yellowstone.

IV. SERIES IV: INTERPRETATION AND EDUCATION, 1961, 1964, 1989-1990

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This subseries contains maps and architectural drawings. Included are a maps documenting locations of interpretive signs as well as drawings of exhibits, museums, and visitor's centers.

V. SERIES V: FACILITIES AND MAINTENANCE, 1903-2007, undated

This subseries contains maps, architectural drawings, and engineering drawings of buildings, trails, roads, and other infrastructure of Yellowstone National Park developed in the post-Military period from 1916-2003. Although some drawings are for concessioner owned and constructed buildings, it appears that the drawings herein were copies submitted to the NPS for comment or approval.

A. *SUBSERIES A: ARCHITECTURAL DRAWINGS, 1903-2006, undated*

Files are arranged by geographic area and thereunder chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains maps and blueprint architectural drawings. Early drawings include plans for the Yellowstone Park Company and Yellowstone Hotel Company drawn by Robert C. Reamer, architect for the Mammoth Hotel, Canyon Hotel, and the Old Faithful Inn, and Fred F. Willson, who designed buildings residences, employee dormitories, and maintenance buildings. Other drawings include Haynes Studios and Hamilton Stores facilities and residences for YPC's Harry Child and W.M. Nichols. The 1930s and 1940s period includes renovations of buildings in developed areas, such as Mammoth, Old Faithful, and Lake led by the NPS Branch of Plans and Design.

The 1950s to 1960s period includes drawings by the NPS Branch of Engineers and Architects, Western Office and the later Western Office Division of Design and Construction (WODC). This period is also documented by Yellowstone Park Company drawings related to the "Mission 66" initiative. The 1970s and 1980s materials focus on facility construction and renovation projects conducted by the Denver Service Center. The 1980s to 2000s include drawings from concessioner contractors Trans World Services, Amfac Parks and Resorts, and Xanterra Parks and Resorts.

B. *SUBSERIES B: ENGINEERING DRAWINGS, 1909-1992, undated*

Files are arranged by geographic area and then chronologically by year.

This sub-series contains maps, blueprints, and overlay drawings that detail water, sewer, electrical systems, radio networks, and liquefied petroleum gas installations. Other drawings include diagrams of steamer boats. The Engineering Division of the NPS Branch of Plans and Design produced drawings for the 1930s and 1940s. The 1950s period is documented by drawings created by the Engineering Division of the Western Office and the 1960s consists of drawings from the Engineering Division of Western Office Division of Design and Construction. Remaining years are documented by drawings from the Yellowstone National Park Engineering Division and subcontractors.

C. *SUBSERIES C: ROADS AND TRAILS, 1921-2007, undated*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains maps and engineering drawings. The years 1926-1940 are consist of drawings from the USDA Bureau of Public Roads and the NPS Branch of Plans and Design. 1950s and 1960s drawings are from the Landscape Architecture and Engineering branches of the NPS Western Office Division of Design and Construction. Drawings produced in the late 1960s and 1970s come from the Federal Highway Administration, and mostly consist of bridge rehabilitation projects, and upgrades to the Grand Loop road. Annotated USGS and Landscape Architecture trail maps are also included.

VI. *SERIES VI: FIRE MANAGEMENT, 1930-2003, undated*

This series contains annotated maps, Mylar plastic overlays, posters, and architectural drawings related to fire management in Yellowstone National Park.

A. *SUBSERIES A: FIRE PROGRESSIONS (non-1988), 1930-2003, undated*

Files are arranged chronologically by year.

This sub-subseries contains maps and architectural drawings. This includes drawings of the Fire Cache Building, No. 38, and Fire Lookouts at Mount Sheridan and Divide Creek. The maps include seen area maps from various outlooks across Yellowstone and fire progression maps for single fire incidences from 1930-2003.

B. *SUBSERIES B: 1988 FIRES, 1988*

Files are arranged chronologically.

This sub-subseries contains annotated maps, Mylar plastic overlays, and posters. The maps include fire progressions from the North Fork, Wolf Lake, Mink, Canal Creek, Lafayette Lake, Storm Creek, Hellroaring, Snake River, and Clover Mist fires between August-October 1988. Fire Cache Final Burn Overlays are included from December 1988. The sub-subseries also includes posters and parkwide maps that illustrate the extent of the 1988 Fire.
