Safety Closure – Fire Area and Accident Investigation


The Dog Rock Fire began burning inside Yosemite National Park on the afternoon of October 7, 2014. During the subsequent firefighting effort, a CalFire air tanker crashed on the hillside above Highway 140 inside the fire perimeter. In order to maintain the safety of park visitors, and to allow recovery and firefighting operations to continue unimpeded, the Superintendent of Yosemite National Park is designating a portion of the park as closed. The area will remain closed until further notice is given.

By order of the Superintendent of Yosemite National Park and under authority of Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 1.5(a) and Section (a)(1):


The area north and south of Highway 140 between the park's western boundary and Arch Rock Entrance is closed to public entry. This closure extends south of Highway 140 to the Merced River and north to ¼ mile south of the Foresta Road. This closure includes all climbing routes at the area referred to as "Parkline Slab".

Notice of closure will be posted and the area will be monitored to ensure compliance. Your cooperation in complying with this temporary restriction is greatly appreciated. Please see the attached map.

The designation will remain in place until rescinded.


